Questions

Suspect Number 1

- **10 Points**

- **8 Points**

- **6 Points**
His wide screen debut came in the 1981 film “Taps” and was followed by roles in “The Outsiders”, “Risky Business” and “Legend”
- **4 Points**
His big break came when he starred opposite Kelly McGillis in a 1986 blockbuster where he played pilot Pete 'Maverick' Mitchell
- **2 Points**
He was once married to actress Nicole Kidman

Our suspect is none other than Top Gun himself, Tom Cruise

Suspect Number 2

- **10 Points**
Our second suspect was born on 3rd August 1946 in Essex, he went to the Brentwood School, then in 1967, he went on to Leeds University to study Law
- **8 Points**
he was President of the Leeds Student Union from 1967-68 and President of the National Union of Students from 1968-1971
- **6 Points**
he was called to the Bar in 1972 and worked as a Barrister until 1974 when he became a special adviser to the then Education Secretary the Rt. Hon Barbara Castle
- **4 Points**
In 1979 he was elected MP for the constituency of Blackburn and between 1980 and 1983 he was Opposition Treasury Spokesman
- **2 Points**
In 1999, his son was arrested for selling cannabis which was embarrassing because he became Home Secretary in 1997

Our villain is the Rt. Hon Jack Straw

Suspect Number 3

- **10 Points**
This suspect was born on January 17th 1942 in Louisville Kentucky, his father was a sign and mural painter and his mother was a Domestic
- **8 Points**
He performed poorly at high school, claiming that he was distracted by sport.
- **6 Points**
A local policeman Joe Martin became his sporting mentor before introducing him to trainer Fred Stoner
- **4 Points**
He became Olympic gold medallist at the age of 18 at the 1960 Olympics in Rome
- **23 Points**
At age 22 he beat Sonny Liston to become the World Heavyweight Boxing Champion

Suspect Number 4

- **10 Points**
Our next felon, He was born into a poor Jewish family in Czechoslovakia in 1923 Most of his family including both parents died at the hands of the Nazis. After evacuation to Britain in 1940, he joined the Pioneer Corps and won the Military Cross
- **8 Points**
In 1945 he adopted an English name and dropped his original name of Jan Ludvik Hoch, becoming a British citizen the following year
- **6 Points**
In 1951, he formed Pergamon Press which over the next 15 years made him a publishing millionaire and in 1959 he became a labour MP for Buckingham.
- **4 Points**
He was chairman of Oxford United from 1982-87 and Derby County from 1987.
- **2 Points**
He died in mysterious circumstances in a boating accident in 1991 and was buried in Jerusalem.

He is of course Robert Maxwell

Suspect Number 5

- **10 Points**
Our final suspect was born on April 25th 1940 and he was well known for various film roles, having been nominated for eight Oscars, but only winning once.
- **8 Points**
Some of his early films include, “Me Natalie” and “Does A Tiger Wear A Neck Tie”
- **6 Points**
His big break came in 1972 when he landed a role in Francis Ford Coppola’s film “The Godfather”
- **4 Points**
He went on to star in many smash movies including “Scarface”, “Frankie and Johnny” and “The Devil’s Advocate”
- **2 Points**
He won an Oscar for his role in the film “Scent Of A Woman”

He is the Don himself, Al Pacino
