The Local Church Is Best

"My passion is the local church."

Lucinda Herklots is due to move on in November after fourteen years as Diocesan Secretary. Her journey to faith started in a little Saxon Church near her grandparents' farm in Sussex.

My father was an army officer, so I spent all my holidays there. Then at an Anglican convent secondary school, I



was an acolyte and head of the choir, which meant a great deal to me.

"My darkest hour was at university aged 19, when I became seriously ill and needed a kidney transplant. I just said to God, 'over to you'. He provided. That has been my guiding force ever since.

"My husband, Radu, is a priest's son, and we used to worship and help a little at his father's church near Portsmouth. Then after he retired, we began to get involved in Salisbury Cathedral.

"I worked for 23 years as an electronics engineer, based locally but travelling all over the world. By the early 2000s, I wanted to travel less and see more of Radu. When this job was advertised, it seemed to be perfect, and I was appointed to my surprise and delight.

"It might seem far from the grassroots, but being Diocesan Secretary is about providing the resources for mission and ministry in parishes. The church is best when it is local.

"This is seen as a pressure job, but I've enjoyed these years and leave with very mixed emotions. I've loved the people, places and culture of the Diocese.

"Whatever God has in store for me now, I'll be around in Salisbury for it."

"All six villages are different from one another, making it very interesting.

'I grew up in St Francis' Church in Salisbury, staying involved through to adulthood. I eventually led youth ministry there with my husband Stuart.

Eventually, I became more unsettled in my MoD researcher career, and trained as a counsellor to degree level.



At the same time, I found a call to ordained ministry deepening. As I started to test it, the doors opened one after another.

"I was offered a generous redundancy, which funded me to work part-time during my years training at Sarum. I worked for Bemerton Methodist Church's outreach worker, a great experience of ecumenical working.

I started training on my own financing, not going to selection conference until February of the first year. I am not a risk taker but had a real sense of God calling me out of my comfort zone!

'My curacy was also in Bemerton. The community centre on the estate was a great base to learn how to be a priest, but was quite pioneering - building networks and community.

"I was surprised to find myself applying to work in a country benefice, but we felt a definite call. The same skills are required as in towns. It's

Four New Lay **Ministers**

Four new Licensed Lay Ministers (LLMs) have completed their three-year training at Sarum College and have been admitted to this office, which authorises them to preach and lead worship, among many other things.

Judy Anderson, Diocesan Associate Warden of I.I.Ms, said, "After rigorous training alongside ordinands, they will now minister in local parishes.

"LLMs have a unique role as highly trained theologians based principally in a secular context. This gives them the opportunity to connect with people who may never come to church.

about making the right connections with people. People are still committed to their local church, although they may not come often on Sunday mornings, so we must connect outside the historic patterns.

"A difference is that a rural vicar can't be anonymous, but people have been incredibly welcoming and friendly.

Rural ministry is a full-on job but there are great joys; growing our own vegetables a strong community and good neighbour It's a great place to walk the dogs in tranquil countryside. The village pub is also a great place to build friendships and relationships!"

As we remember the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War and see the tragedy of a lost generation of men, I am reminded of how many people said at the end of the war 'never again' Never again, yet every time we switch on the news on our TVs, and radios or pick up a newspaper, we are bombarded by conflict, conflict between countries around the world. Since 1918 world-wide there has not been a single day without war.

War can seem so far away. Nations fighting for economic gain, territorial gain, religion, nationalism, or simply to defend themselves. This year however it has felt a little closer to home with the Novichock attacks in Salisbury. Also there have been an unprecedented number of conflicts on our national streets, with young people, especially males, losing their lives to gun and knife crime.

Having lived and worked in 2 war zones, firstly on the Thai Cambodian border and then later on the Pakistan Afghanistan border I've seen the horror and effects of war first hand, with civilians so often suffering equally as much as those in military roles. Death, injuries, people maimed and displaced, needing hope to believe that life can ever be good again. The horror and reality of war.

In August 1914 young men around the country signed up for military service. Great Britain had just declared war on Germany and scores of young men signed up, most thinking that the war would be over by Christmas and they would be safely home with their families for the festivities.

How wrong they were. Some returned early, shell shocked and injured while many died in the service of their country. Memorials in our churches bear witness to those who never returned. The Armistice was signed at 5 a.m. on November 11th 1918 and among its 34 clauses, were the following that would come into effect within six hours of signing:

- The termination of all hostilities on the Western Front (11 a.m.)
- Surrender of arms: 5,000 artillery pieces, 25,000 machine guns, 3,000 mine launchers, 1,700 aircraft (including all night bombers), 5,000 railway locomotives, 150,000 railcars and 5,000 road trucks.

The surrender of arms reminds me of the words from Micah 4:3 in the bible – words often read on Remembrance Sunday.

'They shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more' Micah 4:3

The surrender of all weapons and all war ceasing. A sentiment that seems impossible and yet we long for it. We pray for it. And in the mean time we honour those who have fought and died and those who continue to serve.

At the going down of the sun - We will remember them.





Spring Orchard Surgery Newsletter October 2018

This month's newsletter is all about flu - or more specifically the annual flu immunisation programme and why it matters.



The flu virus mutates rapidly, which is why people need to be immunised every year. We are lucky in the UK as we can use data from Australia to guide planning in the UK, as their winter matches our summer and comes 6 months earlier.

The immunisation is produced in labs using the freshest evidence on which strain of flu is most likely to become virulent each year. It can be quite an anxious time waiting for our delivery of the flu vaccines as it is such a fast tumaround from identifying what strain of flu should be in the vaccine, to the labs producing the vaccines, to getting them distributed to the whole of the UK.

Each year there are refinements in how best to immunise the population. The main difference this year is that we now have 2 types of adult vaccine. One – called trivalent has been allocated to over 65s based on evidence that this age group will respond best to this particular form of vaccine. Another - called quadrivalent will be age for atrisk adults under age 65. The third type is a nasal spray of live vaccine. This is used for children (aged 2-17), as they respond best to this form of the vaccine.

A common response from patients when offered a flu jab is "Oh, I don't need one I never get flu". Please can you consider the following message – some people can become carriers or reservoirs of flu virus without showing symptoms. This increases the risk of other people contracting flu from you – and these people may become very poorly if they contract flu. It is why all health workers are immunised against flu – we have many contacts every day with people who will not cope well with flu, and it is part of our care for others to make sure we don't pass the infection on.

Another common response is "I had the flu jab once and I got the flu". The flu jab for adults contains dead (or more accurately 'deactivated') virus. All it does is expose your immune system to the proteins in the flu virus so that when you come into contact with the actual flu infection you are already several steps ahead in mounting the immune response which will kill off the infection. You can't catch flu from dead virus.

We can all do our bit for the whole community if we have the flu jab – imagine that the next person you stand next to at the supermarket is on chemotherapy, or is a toddler who is too young to be immunised – by having the flu jab you will be helping towards what is called 'herd immunity'. Target immunisation rates are set at 75% for all eligible populations and this will reduce the circulating virus levels. This is an indirect way of protecting people from flu, but relies on enough people in the wider community taking up the offer of the flu jab to be effective.

A reminder - these age groups are routinely offered the flu vaccination

- Adults 65 and over (including adults over 18 at risk of flu)
- Pregnant women
- Children aged 2 and 3
- Children in reception class and school years 1,2,3,4 and 5
- Children aged 2 to 17 years at risk of flu.

And what are the risk groups?

I think the best way to think of this, is that these are people for whom developing pneumonia would be dangerous or difficult to recover from, and may require hospital admission

- Respiratory diseases asthma when on regular inhaled steroids, COPD, bronchiectasis
- · Cardiac disease such as heart failure
- Chronic kidney disease
- Chronic liver disease such as hepatitis
- Neurological conditions such as MS, Parkinson's, motor neurone disease
- Diabetes
- Previous splenectomy
- A weakened immune system HIV, regular steroid tablets, chemotherapy, DMARDs such as methotrexate
- Being seriously overweight (BMI of 40 or above)

At Spring Orchard surgery we currently have 729 patients who are eligible for flu immunisation. Please come along to the dedicated immunisation session on 13th October (Saturday morning 09:00 to 11:00) so you can get your flu jab in time for winter.

Please note: Children and under 18s will be invited to a separate clinic at Wilton Old Orchard surgery as all the nasal spray vaccines are being stored there.





Nutrition and More

I heard on the news today that the government wants to fortify all flour with folic acid to try and reduce the increasing incidence of spina bifida in newborn babies. Folic acid is the manufactured form of folate (vitamin B9) which is used in supplements. Folate itself is found in leafy greens especially dark green plants. This is where it gets its name from - folate/foliage. It is also found in legumes (beans, peas and lentils), citrus fruits, egg yolks, asparagus, beetroot, broccoli and Brussels sprouts.

It has been known for many years that a low level of folate in early pregnancy is an important risk factor for the birth of a baby with spina bifida – but there are others. These include: Family history, some medications taken by the mother (especially anti-convulsants), maternal diabetes which may cause poor blood sugar control/raised blood sugar levels, pre-pregnancy obesity, raised body temperature in early pregnancy (from fever/saunas etc) and lower socioeconomic status – where the link may be inability to afford adequate nutrition. A developing foetus needs all the nutrition it can get in order to build a healthy body and brain and will rob its mother if she is not supplying sufficient via her diet. Many a pregnant mum who says that pregnancy has made her "stupid" may well be losing essential omega 3 fats from her brain in order that the baby may develop its own.

As I have said so often before, getting nutritious food nowadays can be extremely difficult because of industrialized/chemicalized farming and food processing and it doesn't seem sensible to supplement one single vitamin rather than tackling the "disaster area" that our food chain has become – though it may be a useful "stop-gap" until we can all buy food which we know will do us good rather than harm. Sadly, there is no way to tell which foods these are today, because they are all presented to look wonderful and we have no way of knowing whether they are nutrient depleted – other than taking the trouble to buy from a grower/producer who does the job right and will answer the questions we ask about this.

Two of the other risk factors noted above (I got the list from the Mayo clinic in the USA – and the NHS information is almost identical) are pre-pregnancy obesity and poor blood sugar control which are entirely food related. I have written often about refined carbohydrates/starches which after digestion, rapidly arrive in the bloodstream as glucose and confuse the pancreas into producing too much insulin to deal with the excess blood sugar. This can then cause a drop in blood sugar – and eventual "insulin resistance" if this happens regularly. Insulin resistance is now recognized as being involved in the development of obesity and type 2 diabetes. Our advised low fat/high carbohydrate diets are implicated in this.


This is beautifully illustrated, with appropriate graphs, in a study done by a fellow student on my nutrition course with himself as the subject: On day one, after fasting for 18 hours, he ate a large amount of white potato mashed with butter and accompanied by some oily fish (fat and protein). His blood sugar measurements rose a little and then returned to normal in a gentle curve – just as it should. On day two (after the same length of fasting) he ate the same amount of potato accompanied by some carrots to make up the same bulk (no fat or protein). His blood sugar rose rapidly, far above normal, making him "sweaty" and then dropped rapidly below normal levels making him feel "weak and shaky". Potato, a very starchy food, digests quickly just like white flour/white rice/sugar products.


