Ruth Peers is the Community Advocate Worker at St Francis, Littlemoor, Dorset. She took on the role after she was asked to pray about it by her Vicar...

I was a missionary in Russia for years, so I'm used to getting my hands dirty. I missed doing that and I thought it was an ideal opportunity to do that here in Littlemoor.

Transforming Lives

No day is the same, I'm based at the cafe at the church, it is a really good point of contact, and I'm building up relationships. I take part in 'Open the Book'. I help people with benefits, food vouchers and whatever it is they need and I plan for 'Make Lunch' in the school holidays.

Then with Transforming Lives for Good', we are doing early intervention. Just helping children who are struggling in the system. Basically you are working in a volunteer role with one child for one hour a week, sitting with them, sometimes playing games with them, getting to know them. Then doing some work on emotional literacy and just trying to raise their self-confidence so they can also reach their potential like the other children in the class.

We went on a really good training day and it was really encouraging, it was done in a way to help us know we would be able to do that, because we are doing it in God's strength. It was all about.

The Rt Revd Dr Andrew Rumsey Bishop of Ramsbury

It's that time of year when schoolchildren everywhere begin to receive their end of term reports and the results of tests.

Reports and exams are such a constant part of childhood: until the age of 21, my progress was constantly tested and assessed. I knew precisely how good I was at certain subjects: where I really needed to try harder, where I fell completely short and precisely where I stood in comparison to my friends.

As an adult it is far harder to know how we are progressing: in our professional lives, in our relationships, and indeed in our Christian faith. Hearing and reading God's word in the Bible is perhaps the main way in which we consider how our lives measure up to Christian standards - it should perhaps give us that same blend of reassurance and discomfort!

The prophet Amos, speaking to a nation that remained politically and spiritually smug whilst oppressing the poor and ignoring the needy, portrays God with a plumb line in his hand, about to test whether they are true to his ways.

Flee away, you seer! is the response of the religious leadership, who - like us - find it almost impossible to hear accurate criticism.

What makes it possible is the grace of God in Christ, who both shows us how we ought to live, but crucially also bears the cost of our failure to do so - saving us from our sins and for a



life of good works.

Whatever tests of life we are facing, and whatever the report, for or against us, may this grace encourage and empower us in God's service.

A review into Fairer Share is underway, led by Rosemary Cook, Lay Chair of Pewsey Deanery and a member of the Diocesan Finance Committee, Rosemary is also on Bishop's Council.

The idea of a Review had originally come from comments at a meeting for Lay Chairs and Rural Deans. They had concerns about a lack of consistency. What was revealed was a myriad of different approaches, especially with 'fresh expressions', and that was concerning.

There was a deep seated desire for clarity and consistency and so we set up a Task Group made up of some of the Rural Deans and Lay Chairs.

But then Bishop John Gladwin's

Fairer Share

Review of Renewing Hope widened the scope and so our remit grew.

Bishop John emphasised that the 'counting members in order to determine what we are asking parishes for in support of the Diocese' is often seen as a tax. And growing numbers can mean a larger bill. So the question does need to be asked - 'Is our current system fair?'

So we now have a wider remit to look at all aspects of Share mechanism, but, I think I need to stress this, we are not looking at the actual amount parishes are paying.

However, it is worth saying that, compared to other Dioceses, we do have a very high percentage of payment - 97% of Share request for 2018 was paid - that might indicate that the scheme is working.

But our feedback suggests there is room for improvement. So very careful consideration is needed before we propose changes.

"The Fairer Share Task Group is currently preparing a draft report for

the Finance Committee and Bishop's Council, but there is much work still to do, particularly modelling the financial impacts of various proposals under consideration.

If our draft proposals receive support, the Task Group will work with Focus Groups to gauge reactions and refine the proposals in the light of their comments.

Participants in the Focus Groups will include many of those who have already fed views into the Task group. But we will be seeking to include a mixture of people reflecting the variety of worshipping styles, parish sizes, geographical locations and rural/non-rural communities to be found in the Diocese of Salisbury.

So if you would like to propose someone to take part in one of the focus groups, that would be great just let us know."

Any new system would only come into force after September 2021.

We experience many periods of change in the course of our lives, and the summer is a time when many changes occur, particularly for young people. As school breaks up, the year 6 children look forward to moving on to their next school, often with a mixture of excitement and trepidation; those leaving secondary school look forward to university or vocational training; and others look forward to entering the world of work.

At the time of writing, we have had a change in the weather, from a cold, wet June to soaring temperatures and bright sunshine in July. For many of us this signals a time away from our daily routine, enjoying rest and relaxation on holiday, perhaps going away either within Britain or abroad, or just spending time at home away from the busyness of work and the hectic pace of the daily round.

Some of us will be going through major life changes. It has been a joy to see several couples married in the churches during the summer months, and we wish them, and those married in other venues, every happiness in their future lives. The miracle of the birth of a baby turns our lives upside down, changing our relationships and routines for ever, while bringing untold happiness to parents, grandparents and the wider family. On the other hand, some will be experiencing difficult change, such as illness or bereavement; the future may appear dark and uncertain, and day-to-day living may be a struggle.

Any kind of change can be unsettling, and we feel the need for something constant to hold on to, something to bring stability while everything around us is different and unfamiliar. The well-known Psalm 23 reminds us of God's presence with us through the joys and sorrows of life, wherever we may be and whatever our circumstances. 'The Lord is my shepherd,' we read. In ancient times, a good shepherd took tender care of the animals in his charge, taking them to graze on the best grass he could find and even risking his life to protect them should a wild animal attack. The image of God as our shepherd is indeed a powerful and reassuring one. 'Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff - they comfort me.' Even through the most difficult life changes, God is there, whether or not we are conscious of his presence, bringing us strength and comfort. He is there, too, at times of great happiness and rejoicing.

'Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.' Whatever changes we may face in life, God's loving presence with us remains constant, a reassuring anchor in the unpredictable sea of life.

Spring Orchard Surgery Newsletter August 2019

Primary Care Networks

On July 1st we started working in a new way with our neighbouring practices. This new organisational structure (the Sarum West Primary Care Network) is formed from 7 similar rural practices with a combined population of 31,000 patients. Our practices are The Orchard Partnership, Courtyard surgery, Hindon surgery, Mere surgery, Tisbury surgery, Silton surgery and Sixpenny Handley and Broadchalke surgery. These practices have signed an agreement to work collaboratively and some health services in future will be designed and managed via the PCN, rather than by individual practices. The government are keen to improve how healthcare is delivered in community settings, and the PCN is a major stepping-stone to helping us achieve this.

Diabetes update

Understanding how to manage your diet is a pivotal part of good diabetic control. The overwhelming feedback from the recent diabetes group consultations was that it is often bewildering when trying to understand how to eat well with diabetes.

Responding to this feedback, we have secured funding to run an X-pert course (the recommended training course for people with Type II diabetes) locally. The course starts on Wednesday 16th October, 9:30 - 12:00 with weekly sessions for 6 weeks in total. The venue is The Greater Good Pub. There are places for 20 people who have been diagnosed with Type II diabetes and have not been on the X-pert course before. Please let reception know if you would like to take part in the course.

Feedback from previous attendees is that is fun, interesting and helps you have the confidence to make good dietary choices which improve your diabetic control. It is free, and the offer to run the course in Fovant is a brilliant opportunity for providing clinical services on our doorstep.


Also, if this course is well attended, it helps demonstrate that we should be providing services closer to home for all our patients, and we can then push for other courses and services to be provided locally in future.

Hello and welcome to this edited version of the Community Policing Team (CPT) Report for July 2019; it is

mainly an extract from the reformatted report from Warminster now entitled, "Community Policing Team Tisbury Briefing".

HIGH LEVEL CPT UPDATES

(i) Burglaries

The Tisbury area has seen six burglaries in the last two months; five of these are still under investigation. Items stolen include jewellery, cash and antiques.

Readers' attention is drawn to the crime prevention advice below and to the advantages of signing up to Community Messaging and to accessing local Police Facebook sites for updates and urgent requests.

On Community Messaging at www.wiltsmessaging.co.uk, one can also register one's own CCTV systems; this will assist local officers in obtaining evidence quickly when they conduct house-to-house enquiries. Please note that only the Police have access to who has CCTV.

(ii) PCSO News

PCSO Neil Turnbull is to hold Community Drop-In-Sessions in the Nadder Centre. Details are available at the Tisbury Police Facebook site, the Nadder Centre or via email through CPTWestWiltshire@wiltshire.pnn.police.uk; they will also be added to Community Messaging. - (i) Operation Artemis (Rural Crime): This is the ongoing rural crime operation overseen by the Rural Crime Team for the county. They will arrange for specific patrols during the course of the year in cooperation with and supported by the farming community with a view to tackling, deterring and detecting overnight rural crimes. Throughout May over 80 patrols have been conducted in rural areas throughout the West Wiltshire Community Policing Team.
- (ii) Burglaries: Actions include assisting Officers with enquiries relating to these incidents and raising awareness within the community.

(iii) Stop Me

As part of the Wiltshire Rural Crime Partnership, the police are launching stickers that read, "Police STOP ME between 20:00 - 05:00". This is a new initiative to help tackle farm machinery theft in the county. For example, there has been a spate of GPS Tracker thefts with and from farm machinery.

Stickers are now available for our rural communities to apply to their agricultural vehicles, trailers and horseboxes etc. The idea being that if the machinery is seen on the roads between the stated hours by officers not already committed to a call, those officers can stop check the vehicle to ensure it is being used by the rightful owner.

The dry clean adhesive stickers have been distributed in the rural and farming communities across Wiltshire by the local CPTs. NFU Farmers are encouraged to stick these on machinery for officers to see. All PCSO's are spreading the word with local Farmers.

(iv) Reporting

Meanwhile, we encourage all communities to report, with as much detail as possible, any suspicious incident of people and vehicles coming into yards and onto land. Vehicle detail can include the usual indicators such as registration mark, colour, make, model number, etc., but it can also include any obvious scratch, dent, broken light or other damage. Description of unusual features may also help subsequently to identify a vehicle.

RECENT CRIMES AND UPDATES OF NOTE

Berwick St John: 24 June 2019: Criminal Damage:

Offender scratched the victim's vehicle.

Berwick St John: 2 July 2019: Vehicle offences:

Offenders forced entry into the farm by breaking the gates. They then rammed a van into the side of the tractor causing damage and stole five tractor batteries.

Chariton: 21 June 2019:Theft: Two males driving a white Citroen Berlingo van stole three leisure batteries, two scrap batteries and two fencers.

Donhead St Mary: 20 June 2019: Theft: Offenders gained access to garden via neighbour's property and stole several tiles from a summerhouse roof.

Ludwell: 24 June 2019: Traffic offence: Vehicle hit the victim's car damaging the driver's side wing mirror. Female driver of the offending vehicle just drove on, making no attempt to stop.

Semley: 8 July 2019: Theft: Two males drove a red van into the yard at the location, loaded the vehicle with paving slabs, a bag of cement, and a wheel barrow from one of the victim's lorries.

Shaftesbury: 18 June 2019: Burglary (Residential - Dwelling): Offender entered a property and took a handbag and cash. They then took a Satnav device from a car in the grounds of the property.

Tisbury: 18 June 2019: Burglary (Residential - Dwelling): Offender(s) accessed home by forcing a bedroom window.

Tisbury: 21 June 2019: Vehicle offences: Offender stole the two front indicator covers, prised off a rear light cover and left the bonnet up on the victim's vehicle, which was secure.

Tisbury: 23 June 2019: Burglary (Residential - Dwelling): Offenders gained entry to property via window at the front of the house; items were stolen.

Tisbury: 23 June 2019: Drug offence: Offender issued with warning for possessing cannabis.

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH (CSW)

Every two weeks, four Community Speedwatch Schemes across West Wiltshire are selected by the community Speedwatch Team for CPT support (additional targeting, enforcement and patrols) to supplement the CSW team planned sessions.

These are included in our weekly tasking document for action and update. All the results from the supplementary speed checks conducted are fed back to the relevant Town and Parish Councils.

The current Speedwatch Schemes that were supported in the period throughout May and June 2019 included Hindon and Tollard Royal in the Tisbury Beat.

Watch this space for the development of a Tisbury centred CSW scheme.

OTHER INFORMATION

Online reporting of Crime

If a member of the public in Wiltshire has been a victim of crime, or has witnessed a crime, the incident can now be reported *online* to Wiltshire Police. Go to the Wiltshire Police website at www.wiltshire.police.uk, click on the Report button and select Crime from the menu.

If the crime is still happening or the suspect remains on the scene or someone is seriously injured or is in immediate danger it is, of course, an emergency so then please call 999.

CRIME PREVENTION ADVICE

(i) Thefts from Vehicles

- Don't leave anything in your car if it's not there, then it can't be stolen.
- Thieves aren't picky so don't leave even low-value items in your car. Often thieves will smash and grab first and look later to see if what they've stolen is valuable.
- Don't hide it if you hide items under the seat or in the glove box, chances are someone will have watched you. If you cannot avoid leaving something in your car, put it in your boot before you begin your journey.
- Don't leave valuables in your car even for a minute – it only takes a thief a few seconds to smash a window and get what they want, so don't take the chance.
- Don't leave your house keys or anything with your address on it in your vehicle – someone could steal your keys and then gain access into your home.

(ii) Securing Cars

- Always secure your car.
- Always lock your car and wind your windows up, even if you are just posting a letter or going into a petrol station.
- Get a car alarm they not only deter a thief from stealing the car, but also from stealing items from inside it.
- Immobilisers stop the engine from starting if the car is being stolen.

(iii) Beauty Spot Vehicle Advice

Try to park in sign-posted parking areas.

- Be cautious about parking your car in isolation, thieves can be put off when other people are around.
- Do not leave anything in your vehicle. A jacket or coat left behind may be of very little value to you, but a thief may think it has been used to hide a laptop or handbag, and will break into your vehicle to find out.
- Before you leave home, think about what you need and leave any unnecessary items of value at home.
- Whilst enjoying the sights make sure you keep your bag and possessions with you.
- Consider taking pictures of the cars in the car park with you, if it's a small car park. You are allowed to take photos in a public place.

(iv) Home Security

- Most burglaries are opportunistic.
- Always close and lock doors and windows when you go out – even if just for a short time – and when you go to bed at night.
 Don't forget doors into garages and conservatories.
- Make sure your locks and security measures comply with your insurance requirements.
- Join or start a Neighbourhood Watch scheme. Membership of a scheme is a proven deterrent to burglars.
- Keep keys, including shed and car keys, in a place where they're not visible to anyone looking in. Don't leave keys in the door, and never hide a spare key outside.
- Keep valuables hidden and not visible from windows.
- Take photographs of your valuable items for insurance purposes and keep them with your policy.
- Window locks and visible burglar alarms can act as a deterrent to criminals.
- Never leave packaging from new goods visible with your general rubbish. Criminals may see it and target your property.
- Draw curtains in the evening and leave your lights on a timer switch if you're going out.
- Never give your keys to anyone you do not know well. Change locks in a new property so that you know exactly who has the keys.
- Never keep large amounts of cash in the house.
- Consider keeping expensive jewellery, house deeds and other important items in a home safe, anchored to the brickwork.
- Register valuable items free of charge with www.immobilise.com, a property register

- that helps police identify your property and catch criminals.
- Consider registering expensive items with a forensic marking company such as SmartWater at www.smartwater.com

WILTSHIRE BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION 2019 Judges' Report. Medium Villages - South

Fovant

This is a lovely and pretty village, clean and well kept. The judges found the map suggesting the whole parish to be looked at a little difficult to follow as this boundary was not defined. The map did highlight the 8 places of interest - though the telephone box is no longer outside the Youth Club. The Church yard is pleasantly cared for though it was difficult to understand exactly what was considered to be the conservation area as this seemed very insignificant. All the grave stones were left with lichen to consider conservation which is commendable. The playground and recreation area were well mown and clean. The Village Hall had new notice boards and these showed current and informative information. The areas round the Youth Club, Surgery and Shop were well maintained and also the Pub. The stream and its edges are all very attractive and also add to the delightful feel of the whole village. The very helpful and concise Rights of Way booklet was excellent but not all paths were inspected. The Three Towers Community Magazine giving news and views of Fovant and adjoining villages was full of information and showed good community spirit. The Judges felt that the website, in two parts (the part given on the Entry Form to be only the parish council), showed the Parish and Village details to be rather separate - the link from the village site to the parish council site did not work. The Judges did travel to view the Badges from afar and these obviously attract a number of visitors which is admirable.

This village came second out of 4 villages in the South Area. Total marks given - 80. The only items with a full score were numbers 4 and 7 on the Judges' Mark Sheet.



Nutrition and More

I was delighted to find two items on the media this last week about hay meadows — which are currently an absolute picture, with a huge diversity of wild flowers providing nectar for our rapidly disappearing pollinating insects. One programme was "Gardener's World" on BBC 2 and the other was the farming programme on Radio 4 on Saturday morning.

I am not usually up early enough to catch the farming programme but I was so glad I did and was able to hear about enterprising farmers who are successfully re-creating hay meadows from previous arable fields. It was good to know that the goodwill is there and that nature sets to with a will once the appropriate seed mix is sown and she is left to get on with it!

Gardener's World devoted the whole programme to hay meadows. Apparently we have lost something like 90% of the ones that existed when I was a child to intensive farming. I had read this before and it was so good to hear the problem becoming "mainstream" so that more and more people know the facts and we can start to do something about it. The presenters on the programme set about showing how we "ordinary" gardeners can plant nectar rich flowers in our gardens, tubs and window boxes to feed vital insects so that they are around to pollinate all our food plants/trees when the right time comes. The internet gives long lists of suitable plants – starting the year with snowdrops and crocuses and progressing on to things like foxgloves, lavender, rudbeckia, sedums, buddleia and so many more. I was interested to note – as I was researching these – an advertisement from M&S offering "bee-friendly planted hanging baskets". The message is getting out there!

At the moment it's great to go around and see the steadily ripening fields of grain – but it makes me question whether they will be sprayed with Roundup immediately prior to harvest to dry them so that the machines can handle them more easily. Because of this more and more of us are testing positive to urine tests for Glyphosate – the so-called active ingredient in Roundup – as it finishes up in the flour milled from the sprayed grains. Many of us will be eating it every day without knowing that we are doing so. The manufacturers tell us that it is quite safe (well they would say that, wouldn't they?) but independent studies say otherwise and in America there are numerous cases which have come to court where the judge has decreed that substantial (millions of dollars) damages should be paid to claimants who say that they have developed serious illnesses through working with Roundup.

Obviously, much smaller amounts are involved with residues in harvested crops - but I just can't understand how the spraying is allowed. This is one (among many) reason why I always buy organic grain based products.

Glyphosate damages the helpful bacteria in our guts and, since these are a huge and vital part of our immune systems, leaves us more vulnerable to developing a number of illnesses. We can well do without that!







- You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish in which you wish to stand from the day of your nomination onwards, or
- You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish area during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election, or
- Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish area, or
- You have lived in the parish area of within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election

If anyone in the village feels they would like to join the Parish Council to be at the heart of what is going on and help make decisions about where the village is going, please come to the next meeting on Tuesday 3rd September to see how it works and the other people involved. Join in and make 2019/20 a remarkable year for the village.



ENTRY RULES FOR THE SUTTON MANDEVILLE HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY SUMMER SHOW 2019

This year we're easing right up on rules, moving away from the stricter RHS criteria, and relaxing the judging, so that everyone can enter and have a chance of winning!

These are the general guidelines for entries and exhibits:

- 1 All flowers and vegetables exhibited must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the date of the show
- 2 Exhibitors will be required to provide a container for the display of flowers in Class 3 and for the Village Tray of vegetables in Category 14. For flowers in Class 2, returnable containers will be provided, and paper plates will be provided for other vegetables and fruit categories. In Class 1, Categories 1 3 (onions & culinary herbs) you can choose to use your own container if preferred
- 3 Only ONE entry is allowed per exhibitor in each class, except in the Photography Class, and Craft (Class 6) where exhibitors can enter up to 1 entry per category
- 4 All entry forms must be handed in and fees paid in advance
- 5 Exhibitors must not enter the display area before 3pm. Accommodation will be provided for exhibitors to arrange their entries, which will then be handed to a steward.
- 6 For some awards points are counted, as follows: 3 points are counted for a first prize, 2 points for a second prize and 1 point for a third prize
- 7 The presentation of awards and the draw for the raffle will start at 4.00pm
- 8 Exhibitors may not remove their entries or prize cards until all prizes are announced; any entries unclaimed by 4.45pm will be disposed of by the Society as appropriate
- 9 The judges have the liberty to withhold prizes for want of competition or insufficient merit
- 10 The decisions of the judges will be final in all cases
- 11 The Society will not hold itself responsible for the loss or damage of any property of the exhibitor
