Dear friends,

One of my favourite passages of scripture, often read at Easter is that of the disciples sharing a meal with Jesus on the sea of Galilee following the resurrection (John 21). The story begins with Peter deciding to go fishing. It indicates a slight

sense of 'lostness' following Christ's death. For three years their focus and purpose had been on Jesus and his teaching - were they now to return to what they had been before?

Their work is in vain, they catch nothing and tired from their work they see a figure on the shore. He tells them to let down their nets on the other side and amazingly they obey! To their surprise there are so many fish it is difficult to bring them ashore. Peter recognises Jesus, and doesn't wait to help his colleagues, he jumps into the water, he can't get to Jesus quickly enough.

Jesus has already prepared a barbeque and as they share their breakfast I wonder if Peter is remembering how he had let Jesus down? Only three days before he had been challenged by a servant girl who identified him as one of Jesus' followers. At that moment he had denied Jesus and was forced to watch at a distance as his friend and teacher endured the most horrific torture and death. Then, suddenly on Easter Sunday everything changed, Jesus was risen and appeared to them on several occasions. Great joy must have mingled with deep regret and even guilt for he had let Jesus down badly.

Knowing this, Jesus took Peter to one side and asked him, not to explain his actions, but to answer a simple, powerful question. "Do you love me?" He asked it three times, not only to wipe out his three denials but also, some believe, to offer him the opportunity to explore the depths of his heart until he says with faith "Lord, you know everything, you know that I love you".

It is reassuring that the authors of the Gospels did not portray the early disciples as perfect, indeed they were far from it. From their stories we see how God deals with doubt, denial and abandonment. The Lord knows our heart, he knows when we love and when that love goes lukewarm or when fear overtakes us, and he loves us in spite of who we are.

This Easter-time as we journey from the cross to the empty tomb – let us remember that this was God's plan to bring salvation to all people- salvation to us as individuals and let us rejoice in a God who loves us even though we don't deserve it. A God who asks us to do nothing but simply put our trust in Christ.

Peter went on to do great things for Jesus and showed great courage. Jesus' love enabled him to put the past behind him. How about us? Are there things we need to bring to Jesus? Do we need to respond to his question 'do you love me?" As we journey on together with the risen Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit let us help one another to see the truth of God's unconditional love.

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND AND ITS ELECTORAL ROLLS

The Church of England is approaching its season of Annual Meetings when YOU have a chance to cooperate directly with the wider Church through the election of Churchwardens and lay representatives to your Parochial Church Council (PCC). If you wish to participate then you must ensure that your name is entered on the Church Electoral Roll of your parish. In 2019 each Church Electoral Roll must be completely renewed and it is NOT possible to carry names over onto the new Roll.

The Church of England's Representation rules state:

"A lay person shall be entitled to have his/her name on the role of the parish if he is baptised, of 16 years upwards, has signed an application for enrolment and declares himself/herself either —

(a) to be a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion therewith resident in the parish; *or*

(b) to be a member and, not resident in the parish, to have habitually attended public worship in the parish during a period of six months prior to enrolment; or

(c) to be a member in good standing of a Church which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity (not being a Church in communion with the Church of England) and also prepared to declare himself/ herself to a member of the Church of England having habitually attended public worship in the parish during a period of six months prior to enrolment."

Filgroup Meeting February -

"Edukaid and The Kushona Project"

Rebecca Clayton - a former founder of our group - returned to the village to talk to Filgroup about her experiences with the local charity Edukaid. Having been a keen seamstress all her life she found that despite thoroughly enjoying her work as a Network Manager at St. Joseph's School, she wasn't being fulfilled on the creative side. After developing her own online crafts site, she was then picked by Liberties to become one of their designers and featured in the television programme about the famous London store. She continued to design for Liberties for about three years juggling full time work during the day and designing and sewing in the evening until taking on a complete restoration of an old bungalow in Harnham forced her to give it up, though she continues to have her on line site. Then a friend introduced her to Edukaid, a small charity run by the Dench family and she began to learn about the valuable work they do, educating children in a remote part of Tanzania. Whilst helping to make strings of bunting for fund raising it occurred to Rebecca that if they taught the women to sew for themselves they could make garments and items to sell and so become independent. With this idea the Kushona Project was born. After a year of preparations and further fund raising, Rebecca left England to spend three weeks in the village of Mikindani to begin the task of teaching the women and girls to sew. Her first hurdles were the terrific heat and the extremely basic accommodation, followed closely by the fact that the two sewing machines she had ordered were treadle machines! Everything had to be bought from the highly colourful markets using an interpreter and help from the friendly locals. On her first day so many women and teenagers turned up they had to cut the numbers and she ended up with 9 in two groups, (plus two babies), all very keen to learn and determined to master the treadle. After just three days, they could make and wear skirts in the beautiful local fabrics.

Whilst there, Edukaid celebrated their 15th birthday and the ladies of the village managed to cook for 300 people. The charity will fund the project for a year, so that eventually the girls will be able to make enough clothes to sell. Word is already spreading and they are now teaching their friends to sew. Rebecca is making plans to return and we hope she will come back to Filgroup and give us an update on her

inspirational adventure. Filgroup's members





OPERATION SCEPTRE

During the week Monday March 11th to Sunday March 17th we have been supporting the national week of action entitled, "Operation Sceptre".

Launched by Metropolitan Police in 2015 in • response to knife crime, Op Sceptre aims to raise awareness of the growing trends, with the overall aim of reducing knife crime and the harm it causes to individuals, their families and the wider community.

Any incident where a knife is involved with the intention to threaten or harm another person is a concern to us. Recent statistics from the Office of National Statistics show that knife crime has fallen by 18 per cent across Wiltshire since September 2017 but we are not complacent and recent events in Trowbridge show how important it is that we continue to educate all members of our community about knife crime.

During this week of action Wiltshire West CPT will be working with a number of partner agencies, including the Youth Offending Team (YOT) and Children's Services such as the NSPCC to target antisocial behaviour and knife related incidents within our policing area.

OTHER INFORMATION Crime Exceptions Data for Tisbury and the surrounding area

These figures are based on an evaluation of data, over a two-year rolling period. Using this data we can predict what figure is the average that should be reported in a specific month, and what are the higher and lower parameters that we may expect. Figures outside of these parameters are classed as 'Crime Exceptions'. Domestic Abuse figures will also be included in the values as it is on our Control Strategy but here will be no details shared on these cases.

February 2019 showed a total of 21 crimes for the whole Tisbury Beat area (EB11) against the average of 20.7 for this same month over the last 2 years. This is within the parameters we would reasonably expect. There are no exceptions within the data.

COMMUNITY six largest crime groups accounted for 95% of this recorded crime as follows:

- Violence Against the Person showed 9 crimes compared to the average of 4.9
- Burglary showed 4 crimes compared to the average of 4.2
- Public Order showed 2 crimes compared to the average of 1.3
- Criminal Damage showed 2 crimes compared to the average of 3.2
- Theft showed 2 crimes compared to the average of 3.7
- Vehicle Crime showed 1 crime compared to the average of 3.7

Recent Crimes and Updates of note

Charlton: 27 February 2019: Burglary (Residential): Overnight on the 26th February suspects gained entry to an unoccupied property (under renovation) by smashing a window and unlocking a door. Once inside the suspects stole property including lead for a roof and two drills.

Donhead St Andrew: 1 March 2019: Theft: Overnight on the 28th February suspect(s) stole scrap metal from a back garden of a property by entering through a hedge.

Donhead St Mary: 10 March 2019: Theft: Between the 6th and 10th March suspect(s) stole lead from the church roof.

Ludwell: 17 February 2019: Vehicle offences: Between 13.40 and 14.00 hours suspect smashed the passenger side window of a vehicle and stole a handbag containing a purse and bank cards.

Swallowcliffe: 14 February 2019:Theft: Between 16.00 and 17.15 hours suspect(s) are believed to have stolen a miniature Southdown sheep from a field.

Tisbury: 17 February 2019: Criminal Damage: Overnight on the 16th February suspect forced open locked side gate to a garden and damaged an old garden table, possibly used to stand on to try to access a flat roof without success. No sign of any other damage or attempt to gain entry.

Tisbury: 22 February 2019: Theft: At around 09.35 hours suspect took money from a cashpoint after the victim, forgetting to take his money, had walked away.

Tisbury: 3 March 2019: Vehicle offences: Between 11.30 and 15.00 hours suspect stole a handbag from an insecure vehicle. The handbag contained bank cards that were subsequently used.

Tisbury: 6 March 2019: Burglary (Community): At around 05.00 hours suspects forced entry to the premises by damaging a door and carried out a 'messy' search removing £100 in cash, a fridge, some spirits, the profits from a fruit machine, and three charity boxes.

Tisbury: 10 March 2019: Vehicle offences: At around 12.30 hours suspect stole a handbag from an insecure vehicle containing a mobile phone, some air tickets and other personal items; the car was only unattended for a few minutes.

Community Policing Priorities within the Tisbury Beat

Inspector Andy Fee chairs a weekly internal "tasking meeting" where emerging community issues and concerns are raised and discussed for the whole West Wiltshire CPT area. From this meeting, priorities and actions are set and a tasking document produced. This involves developing strategies and the targeting of resources (including partner agencies) into tackling the issue or concern.

The West Wiltshire and the Tisbury Area currently have the following priorities:

(i) Operation Artemis: Poaching and Hare Coursing. Rural and remote locations and farms around Tisbury and surrounding villages are at risk from Poachers damaging fences and gates to access land to Hare Course and Poach. This sometimes leads to cattle and sheep escaping out onto the roads causing issues for motorists and for the farmers. Crops and fields are also being damaged. We are conducting pro-active patrols to reduce this type of crime.

Community Speedwatch (CSW)

Every 2 weeks, 4 Community Speedwatch Schemes across West Wiltshire are selected by Leanne Homewood for CPT support (additional targeting, enforcement and patrols) to supplement the CSW team planned sessions. These are included in our weekly tasking document for action and update. All the results from the supplementary speed checks conducted are fed back to the relevant Town and Parish Councils in their individual Police Reports. The current Speedwatch Schemes being supported in the period until 13th March 2019 do not include any in the Tisbury Beat.



Nutrition and More

I listened, with horror, to the American idea of European farming practices being "A Museum of Agriculture" which needed to be brought up to American standards - which was all over the media a week or two ago - and I applauded the British farmers who leapt to the defence of traditional farming.

I believe that there is a great deal which needs to be improved in European/British agriculture, but it all pales into insignificance when compared with the American way of doing things! This includes miles and miles of genetically engineered crops, such as corn and soya, which are drenched routinely in Roundup; "feedlots" crammed with cattle, paddling around in their own waste, being fattened on hormones and grains ready for market and fed on antibiotics to try and prevent them getting ill in their dreadful living conditions; chickens which are so bacterially contaminated after slaughter that they need to be washed in chlorine prior to being sold. Add to this the soil degradation caused by the chemical sprays, the waterway and groundwater contamination caused by the chemical run-off and the resulting environmental/insect/wildlife destruction and we need to ask ourselves "Is this really the way we should be going in the UK?" We need to ask our politicians this too!

Our local MP Andrew Murrison (who must be fed up with hearing from me by now!) seem to be confident that as and when we leave the E U and get rid of the Common Agricultural Policy we will be able to set much improved environmental standards here and direct subsidies in a better way to those who take care of their land an everything that lives on it, rather than simply to those who have the most land and grow huge monocultures of crops.

I do hope that he's right and that we eventually get to that point!

With regard to genetically modified crops, we don't grow them in the UK, thank goodness, but they do already arrive here as part of animal feed – I have read the contents list on a number of feed sacks. Whether they also come as a result of imported corn and soy and other crops, which seem to be present in so many of our processed foods now, I don't know.

When was it decided, I wonder, that the plants which nature has provided, and with which we have evolved for millions of years, needed to be "improved"? I read that apples and potatoes are the latest foods to be modified in the USA.

We can take it for granted that the present modifications have absolutely nothing to do with the health and well-being of the consumers and everything to do with increased profits for the producers of the seeds and the chemicals needed to grow them, and also the food producers. I understand that apples are modified to prevent them going brown when cut. This browning is brought about by phytochemicals in the apples which are probably part and parcel of the health promoting properties of the fruit. Presumably the idea behind this is to be able to sell sliced apples as a snack food without them going brown. No doubt "prepared" apples will cost far more than a whole apple – think potatoes and potato crisps!

Also, non-modified but conventionally grown apples in the UK can be sprayed up to eight times during a growing season and many of these sprays become an integral part of the fruit and cannot be washed off the skin prior to eating the apple. So much for "An apple a day keeps the doctor away"! It used to be true but not now, unless the apples are organic or out of your own garden and unsprayed!






