Spring Orchard Surgery Newsletter
July 2018

Reading Group suggestion

We have had an excellent idea from one of our patients to set up a Spring Orchard surgery reading group. This is developing the theme of setting up group consultations for various conditions, and we thought this might be a good consultation format for people who are older and becoming more frail.

The format would be to meet on the fourth Wednesday of the month from 12 til 1:30 pm, we will rotate the book choice so each participant gets to choose a book, but it should have a health theme. As time goes by, we may discover books which are really popular or helpful, and we can create a library of recommended books for all our patients to share.

If you are interested in this idea, please let reception know and we will send you an invitation to the first meeting which will be on the 24th July. If you have any questions, please just ask at reception. The first book will be "Fragile Lives" by Steven Westaby.

Results

This item relates to some recent feedback about results. There are multiple ways in which results are processed at the surgery, and we need to simplify this and improve the consistency of communicating results back to you all.

Firstly – if a test has been requested from somewhere else - such as the hospital – please can you contact them first. This is in line with clear professional guidance that 'the person who requests the test must follow up the result' and improves patient safety by having a clear line of accountability back to the requesting clinician.

For tests requested by the GP surgery (typically blood tests and X-rays), the most efficient way to receive results information is if you can confirm with reception that you are happy to receive text messages from the surgery. Then when a result comes back we text you a short message so you know what to do next.

The following table may help explain how the results are processed. If there is any doubt about how the result should be managed, then the processing will default to the safest method (i.e. go up the table)

Serious / Complex + Urgent	
e.g. abnormal potassium, or urgent hospital referral needed to rule out cancer	
Clinician will call you and discuss it directly	
Serious / Complex + Not Urgent	
e.g. diabetic control has deteriorated, or a shared decision needed about a referral	
Receptionist will call you to come in to see clinician, or arrange a phone consultation to discuss further.	
If no answer, then answer machine message will be left, and a letter will be sent to home address (new policy).	
Not Serious / Simple + Urgent	
e.g. urine sample has shown an infection	
Receptionist will call you and inform you that prescription is ready to collect	
Not Serious + Not Urgent	
e.g. annual blood monitoring results	
We will inform you of the result when you next see a clinician.	
Or, the result is available if you call and ask receptionist (we can print off the result if you wish).

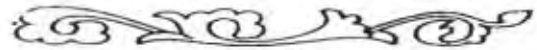


SALISBURY CATHEDRAL CHOIR

**WILTSHIRE WEST CPT DEMAND OVERVIEW – 12
MONTHS TO APRIL 2019**

Hello and welcome to this edited version of the Community Policing Team (CPT) Report for June 2019; it is extracted from the reformatted report from Warminster entitled, "Community Policing Team Tisbury Town (sic) Council Briefing".

PERFORMANCE

Local Area - Five Highest Crime Groups over the past twelve months

- Violence With injury 14.5%
- Violence Without Injury 14.4%
- Criminal Damage 14.3%
- Shoplifting 12.2%
- Other 44.6%
- Wiltshire Police has reduced the volume of recorded crime by 1% in the 12 months to March 19 and has one of the lowest crime rates in the country.
- Our service delivery remains consistently good.
- In May we received 8,429 999 calls which we answered within 3 seconds on average and 13,294 CRIB [Crime Recording and Incident Bureau] calls which we answered within 1 minute 3 seconds on average.
- In May, we also attended 1543 emergency incidents within 10 minutes and 13 seconds on average.
- Wiltshire Police has seen a 46% increase in cybercrime (includes stalking & harassment, sexual offences and public order) in the 12 months to March 2019. This shows one example of the changing nature of demand on the police.
- The Crime Survey of England & Wales recently ranked Wiltshire as one of the top forces nationally for public confidence. It covers the 12 months to December 2018 The publication can be found at: www.crimesurvey.co.uk

- 25 Crimes reported including 9 Violent, 1 Sexual, and 6 Theft offences
- 8 Domestic Violence reports
- 1 Missing person report, that of a child
- 128 Database records created, as were 62 Niche records and 63 Command and Control records
- Three Teams of 14 Community Policing Officers employed alongside 5 PCSOs

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH (CSW)

Every 2 weeks, 4 Community Speedwatch Schemes across West Wiltshire are selected by Leanne Homewood for CPT support (additional targeting, enforcement and patrols) to supplement the CSW team planned sessions. These are included in our weekly tasking document for action and update. All the results from the supplementary speed checks conducted are fed back to the relevant Town and Parish Councils in their individual Police Reports. The current Speedwatch Schemes being supported in the period throughout May 2019 included 3 checks in Hindon in the Tisbury Beat; no vehicles were observed exceeding the speed limit.

STAFFING

Inspector Andy Fee is currently responsible for the 10 Community Policing Teams across the western area. These are based at Trowbridge and Warminster police stations with 5 teams in each covering a 24/7/365 duty pattern.

Each team is made up of Police Officers, Police Community Support Officers and Local Crime Investigators. Central to these officers are my Community Coordinators who are very much the heart

of the team and whom many of you will know on first name terms.

In addition to these officers we have a number of Special Constables who are aligned to the teams. They will try to work predominantly with their aligned team but can slot in anywhere around their availability.

PRIORITIES FOR WILTSHIRE WEST CPT

Operation Artemis (Rural Crime): This is the ongoing rural crime operation overseen by the Rural Crime Team for the county. They will arrange for specific patrols during the course of the year in cooperation with and supported by the farming community with a view to tackling, deterring and detecting overnight rural crimes. Throughout May over 80 patrols have been conducted in rural areas throughout the West Wiltshire Community Policing Team.

HIGH LEVEL UPDATES FROM THE POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER

101 call charges dropped: At present 101 callers are charged a 15p connection fee by the telephony company. From next year this charge will no longer apply and calls to 101 will be free, after the Home Office pledged £5 million each year to cover the cost.

Recruitment - To update on the additional officers and staff promised earlier this year, we had three transferees police officers start this month and another ten due to start in September. Police officers currently have five months initial training and a two-year probation period. It takes time to recruit and train officers to a high standard. During May 20 new police officers began their training and we are planning for a double intake of 40 students in October. From then our police officer recruitment is changing with three new entry routes, including a new three-year Police Constable Apprenticeship Degree, starting in June 2020. We are also on track to have 12 additional Community Co-ordinators in post across the county to focus on improved visibility and community engagement.

Domestic Violence campaign - As part of a joint campaign with Wiltshire Police the PCC wrote an open letter to residents last month outlining what constitutes domestic abuse, the support available to victims and promoted Clare's Law which allows individuals to enquire about their partner, friend or family member's past. In 2018, 299 people used this scheme.

HIGH LEVEL FORCE UPDATES

New ACCs appointed: Wiltshire Police has appointed two new Assistant Chief Constables. ACC Mark Cooper joined the Force from Dorset Police on 20 May and is due to be followed by ACC Maggie Blyth on 4 June. National Volunteers' Week: During the first seven days of June we will be celebrating those who support Wiltshire Police by giving up their time and skills for free. We will be highlighting the invaluable support we receive from various groups, including our Specials and Community Speed Watch.

Tisbury: 11 May 2019: Theft: Offender stole working cocker spaniel from kennel at farm location.

Tisbury: 12 May 2019: Burglary: Offender smashed the window of a door to gain access.

Tisbury: 25 May 2019: Burglary (Business and Community): Offenders(s) entered farm yard and barn and then, using a generic key to gain access to tractors, stole from the tractors a Real-time kinematic (RTK) satellite dish, a four global positioning system (GPS) control screen, and a Greenstar 3 satellite dish.

OTHER INFORMATION

With the warmer weather approaching, we start to see an increase in theft from motor vehicles.

Thefts from Vehicles

- Don't leave anything in your car - if it's not there, then it can't be stolen.
- Thieves aren't picky - so don't leave even low-value items in your car. Often thieves will smash and grab first and look later to see if what they've stolen is valuable.
- Don't hide it - if you hide items under the seat or in the glove box, chances are someone will have watched you. If you cannot avoid leaving something in your car, put it in your boot before you begin your journey.
- Don't leave valuables in your car even for a minute – it only takes a thief a few seconds to smash a window and get what they want, so don't take the chance.
- Don't leave your house keys or anything with your address on it in your vehicle – someone could steal your keys and then gain access into your home.

Securing Cars

- Always secure your car.
- Always lock your car and wind your windows up, even if you are just posting a letter or going into a petrol station.
- Get a car alarm – they not only deter a thief from stealing the car, but also from stealing items from inside it.
- Immobilisers stop the engine from starting if the car is being stolen.

Beauty Spot Vehicle Advice

- Try to park in sign-posted parking areas.
- Be cautious about parking your car in isolation, thieves can be put off when other people are around.
- Do not leave anything in your vehicle. A jacket or coat left behind may be of very little value

to you, but a thief may think it has been used to hide a laptop or handbag, and will break into your vehicle to find out.

- Before you leave home, think about what you need and leave any unnecessary items of value at home.
- Whilst enjoying the sights make sure you keep your bag and possessions with you.

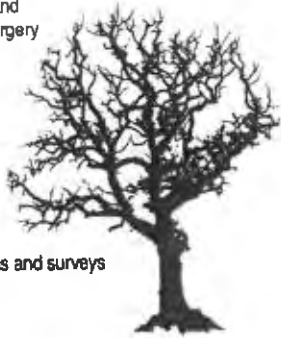

Nutrition and More

At the end of May I went to the Salberg Theatre to listen to a talk by Helen Browning, who is an organic farmer in the north of Wiltshire and also the CEO of the Soil Association which promotes organic growing and farming and oversees organic registrations. She based her talk on the book she had written called "Pig - tales from an organic farm".

I bought her book and have read it very quickly as it was fascinating and easy to read. It tells the story of six months on the farm, starting on the night of the winter solstice when a litter of piglets is born and ending at the summer solstice the following year. Further litters follow quickly and we are treated to the story of them and their mothers – the ups and downs, the worries and joys, their characters, and life on the farm in general. It was a particularly difficult winter that year as it was the one when "The Beast from the East" hit us and we had bitter cold and heavy snow. I finished up with huge admiration for the work that farmers do to produce our food.

It was such a treat to listen to someone talking about all the things that I have been learning about since I started to study nutrition and putting them into the context of organic farming. It made absolute sense of the statement made by Lady Eve Balfour in the 1940's when she started what has now become the Soil Association. She said "Health, whether of soil, plant, animal or man, is one and indivisible. It consists of mutual synthesis between organism and environment".

We have, sadly, totally lost sight of this over the years during which "science" insisted that farmers should overcome nature with chemicals and "industrialized" farming techniques instead of learning to co-operate with her. The result has been impoverished/depleted soils incapable of producing plants with sufficient nutrients to nourish us, or the animals we eat, properly. Ill health is the final result, as our poor NHS is finding out, together with massive environmental pollution and destruction.

Helen Browning spends a lot of her time trying to get these facts over to the people in government who deal with food production and the health of our countryside – and us. It must be a thankless task and I was so pleased to hear that when she is feeling down she goes and visits the pigs – and comes away feeling much better.

The farm has a dairy herd too, and makes cheese – and they raise their male calves alongside "foster mothers" instead of killing them at birth which I believe is normal practice. They also have sheep and grow crops. They own the pub in the local village which feeds its customers with food from the farm and they also own the local shop where their produce is sold. Food miles will be almost non-existent there! The public can book a tour of the farm and I hope to do that later this year – after lunch at the pub of course.

The whole evening was most interesting with all sorts of questions from and discussions with the audience and I came away feeling that there might be hope for the world yet!

- Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your nomination and the day of election has been in the parish area, or
- You have lived in the parish area of within three miles of it during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election

If anyone in the village feels they would like to join the Parish Council to be at the heart of what is going on and help make decisions about where the village is going, please come to the next meeting on Tuesday July 2nd to see how it works and the other people involved. 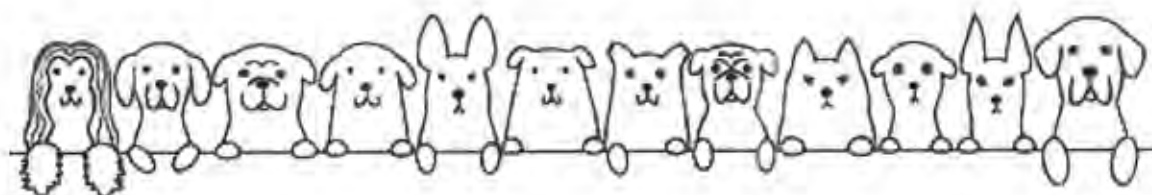

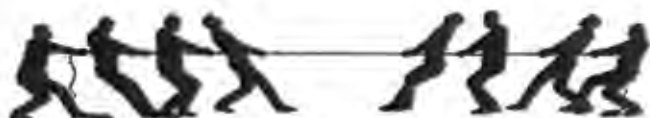

**This position is a voluntary role and you needn't be a Parish Councillor.
Wiltshire Council offer training and support.**

Flood Wardens can help a community to be prepared for **flooding** and **can** bring the community together during difficult times.

Community **Flood Wardens are** members of the local community – they **can** be individuals, existing volunteers or representatives of the Parish Councils.

The Flood Warden does not replace the emergency services but works with them. The Flood Resilience team in Wiltshire includes representatives from Wiltshire Council, the Environment Agency and Fire and Rescue, this team works alongside the Community Flood Wardens.

The Flood Warden should never put themselves in danger.

The following is an extract from the Environment Agency Flood warden Fact Sheet

Who are we looking for as wardens?

- Reasonably fit and able to notify neighbours
- At home during the day or working close to home
- A good communicator - able to explain and pass on information
- Interested in the local area and the river environment
- Ideally not at a high risk of flooding themselves

Liabilities for volunteers? By running this scheme through the Parish Council their public liability insurance will cover flood wardens in the event of anything occurring.

Any person interested should contact the Parish Clerk for further information.
