The lead-in for clergy contributions to our community magazines - surely among the best in the country - requires my contribution for March 2020 to be submitted by February 10th. It feels like wishing one's life away; the years go quickly enough as it is. As I write, Christmas has hardly finished. After January 6th, it is usual to pack up the family nativity set for use next year, when Christmas ends with the visit of the Wise Men ('Three kings'). The details are a bit blurred: in the Gospel story we are told that there were three gifts, gold, frankincense and myrrh, rather than three Wise Men, and the result of the enquiry set in place by King Herod implies that they had been seeking the child for some 2 years. That seems like quite a long search.

My Bishop, in a pastoral letter to be read in all the churches of his diocese after Christmas, recalled his days as a parish priest, when, faced with people enquiring about becoming members of the Catholic Church, his first question would be, 'What are you seeking'. A common answer was, 'to belong'. I guess that is a response encountered by many Christian ministers in similar situations; it certainly was in my Anglican days and it is now. Sometimes an enquirer, describing the journey, talks about a long search.

My heart usually sinks when somebody gives me a book as a Christmas present. This year, however, I was delighted to be given *The Joy of God*, a well-reviewed collection of writings by a Benedictine Sister of St Cecilia's Abbey on the Isle of Wight (Sister Mary David, Continuum 2019, £12.99). She spoke about the quest to find God ('Our desire for God leads us to seek him. It is to embark on a journey'). Shrewdly she observed that the Christian story is as much about finding as seeking, adding that 'today it is seeking that is all the rage, which is prized more highly than finding.'

If you happen to be interested in early Christian heresies, look up Gnosticism (Greek: *gnosis* = knowledge). Sister wrote: 'one of ancient Gnosticism's favourite doctrines was the glorification of the eternal quest, a desire to know all God's mysteries by our own power'. She quoted St Irenaeus on people who are always looking beyond, their quest being eternal, to the point where they never find the truth. I might add, a similar quest for certainty causes some people never to stay in one job or to get round to marrying until they are absolutely certain that *this one is the Right One*. But alas, no-one is perfect. The quest makes a great excuse for never quite committing oneself, and so the joy of belonging is never experienced. Sad, really, but very common. And it looks so plausible.

Well, may your decisions, whatever they are, lead you to much happiness. And if like me you dithered to long on the edge of the school swimming pool you will never know the joy of being a confident swimmer.

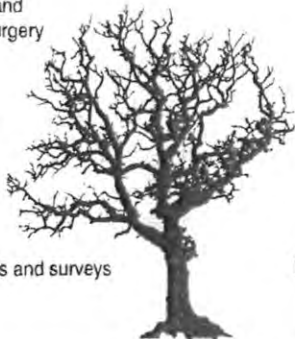

Team Leader required

This position is a voluntary role and you needn't be a Parish Councillor.

Wiltshire Police offer training and support.

Fovant High Street meets the criteria for operating CSW but in order for the scheme to be active a Team Leader is required. The Team Leader will need to have a computer with internet access to send and receive the information to Wiltshire Police. The Team Leader works out the rota for sessions and ensures any data is sent to Wiltshire Police.

If you are unable to commit to being a Team Leader but would like to be a volunteer please contact the Parish Clerk who will pass your information onto the new Team Leader.

Wiltshire Police will provide training for volunteers and also appropriate safety jackets, they also assess suitable sites to operate the speed device. The speed device is shared amongst participating villages, Fovant was part of the Teffont and Dinton group so could have the equipment for 2 weeks in every 6.

Any person interested should contact the Parish Clerk for further information.

Please note that CSW is not part of the Parish Council, the Clerk will put you in contact with the CSW team at Wiltshire Police.

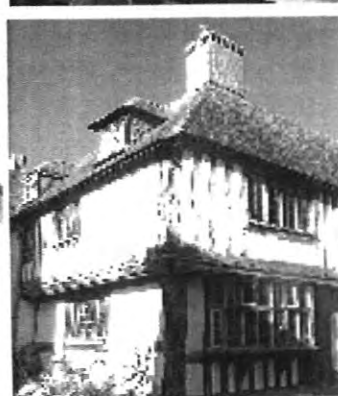

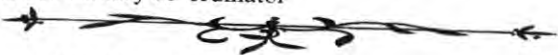

...remember that in 2019, our 850 members with 960 tanks ordered over 1.3M litres of oil and that we were consistently the most competitive source of heating oil around Salisbury and Shaftesbury.

...remember that apart from a very few days when we have just accepted a tender that you can go on to the website www.nadder.oilbuyingclub.com and place your order in case the fortnightly reminder emails are going to your junk box. It's worth marking your junk box so that the following two email addresses are not classified as junk.

richard.willan@me.com and
richard@spireinteriors.co.uk

...give a mobile number on your contact details if there is a good chance no one may be in when the delivery takes place. This enables the supplier and the tanker driver to contact you if they need to.

...remember that if you place a non urgent order at the beginning of the order intake and it is delivered at the end of the delivery window, the lead time is around 25 days. However, an urgent order placed just before we go out to tender may be delivered the following Monday which is a lead time of 5 days.

...remember that to specify your order as urgent, change the drop down box on the order page from standard to urgent.

...run your tank from full to full. Depending on its size place an order for 500 or a 1000 litres as soon as you can see your tank having the room to take it, bearing in mind the lead time above. The reason for this is that if you normally use 40 litres per day and the temperature suddenly drops to freezing, you will find your consumption doubling at the same time as everyone else's does.

...remember you can put a neighbour without IT skills on to your membership or indeed other tanks such as church, village hall or school etc. They will be invoiced direct.

...tell your friends and neighbours about **NOBC**. The more members we have, the cheaper our prices.

...pay within seven days of your delivery arriving. That is the quid pro quo for such good prices.

...help the delivery companies by making sure that your contact and tank details are as up to date as possible. This helps the delivery drivers no end. Please include mobile numbers if your house is likely to be empty when deliveries are made.

...explore Watchman and similar devices which enable you to monitor your tank level from within your home <https://www.kingspan.com/gb/en-gb/products/smart-monitoring/local-tank-monitoring/watchman-sonic>

...remember that you can sign up for the budget scheme which spreads payments over twelve months.

...be reassured that, if you can buy your heating oil elsewhere at a cheaper price within 24 hours of your order confirmation arriving in your inbox, you only have to email me and I will cancel your order. (I haven't had to do it yet!)

...remember that the negotiated price is the price you pay plus 5% VAT. There are no surcharges other than the very rare occasions when a member requires a micro tanker due to access restrictions.

...keep your order confirmation so that if you have a delivery query, you have the supplier's phone number to use.

Don't

...forget that oil suppliers will skin you alive on price if you need an urgent delivery. (Not surprising really as the cost of getting a special delivery to you is high) NOBC is not set up to do emergency deliveries, however, it is always worth emailing me if you have a problem in case I can call in a favour.

...let the condition of your tank deteriorate. It is illegal for heating oil suppliers to deliver to a tank that may leak. Southern Tank Services on the A30 at Sutton Mandeville who cover the majority of the South of England, will always be happy to advise. <https://www.tankservices.co.uk/>

...wait until your tank is three quarters empty before ordering. Keep it topped up.

...order in December if you can avoid it. Prices are much greater than in November and January.

...be surprised if on occasions you are asked to pay up front. You may be a regular NOBC customer but if a particular supplier has not delivered to you recently, they may treat you as a new customer and ask for payment in advance.

...forget to leave a note of the **NOBC** details for your successors if you are moving house.

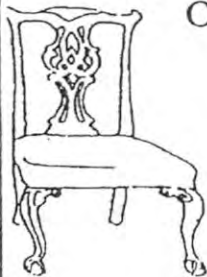

Nutrition Matters

To follow on from the question last time about whether or not we should eat meat I have noticed recently that there is a huge amount in/on the Media about veganism. It has gone so far as to encourage people to try eating a vegan diet during January and calling it Veganuary.

The supermarkets have climbed aboard this potential “gravy train” (perhaps not quite the right word to use about veganism!) and many of them now have a vegan department as well as a vegetarian one. I suspect that they wouldn’t be doing this if it was not a way of increasing profits.

So why do people become vegan? Some simply want to protect animals and will not eat anything which has been produced by captive animals such as milk, butter, cheese and eggs and even honey because they feel that the bees are being exploited for the benefit of humans. To a large extent I would go along with this because animal welfare comes high on my agenda. I am truly appalled by the way that some farm animals are treated - such as caged hens and rabbits and farrowing pigs, and the way that live animals are sent on awful journeys overseas simply to be slaughtered at the other end. I have signed more petitions about the above than I care to think about. This is one of the reasons that I buy organic food whenever I can because animal welfare is written into the rules concerning organic farming. Shoes and clothing made of leather are also taboo in a vegan lifestyle.

I understand that some people become vegan because they believe that the diet is very healthy – and indeed, to a certain extent, it can be. However it needs to be done with great care so that nutrients are properly balanced and a full spectrum of essential amino acids are eaten every day to allow our bodies to build muscle and other tissue and create enzymes for the proper functioning of the body. As we age we sometimes are not able to absorb the necessary nutrients from plants alone. Vitamin B 12 – an extremely important vitamin for many body systems - is a classic example of this. Those of us who eat an omnivore diet get vitamin B12 from animal products and it is hard to get enough of it from vegetable sources. Many vegans end up having to take B12 supplements and I do not believe that a diet can be called healthy if it requires supplements in order to achieve health. Omega 3 fats are slightly difficult to get in the form of EPA and DHA which our brains crave. A conversion can be done in the body from flax oil and certain nut oils but not everyone has enough of the right enzymes to do this adequately. We omnivores get DHA and EPA directly from oily fish and grass-fed animals.

What worries me a lot about this push towards veganism is the idea being put forward that it will “Save the planet”. It absolutely will not! What will save the planet – as I have said so many times before – is creating healthy soils which will grow healthy plants and sequester huge amounts of the carbon dioxide we emit all the time. To create healthy soils you need grazing animals included on every farm. Nobody seems to consider what would happen if we were growing huge acres of soya to create vegan protein. It would be sprayed with just about every farm chemical which would damage the soil structure and its necessary microscopic life together with all the small beastlies and insects which feed birds and small mammals. How does that benefit animals on our precious Earth?

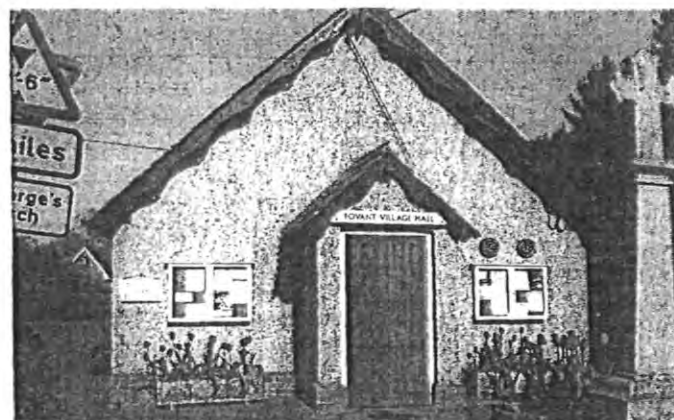

Do you have any trees or hedges that run alongside the highway or a footpath?

Fovant Parish Council continues to receive complaints regarding overgrown hedges and trees which are causing an obstruction.

YOU
are responsible for keeping
YOUR
trees and hedges maintained so that they do not encroach on the highway or footpaths (this includes rights of way).

Overgrown hedges and trees are a hazard to pedestrians and can also obstruct road signs (including speed limit signs which allows offenders to get away with speeding).

Now is the ideal time to get the overgrown vegetation cut back but please remember your own personal safety and wear appropriate clothing.

Please can you ensure your trees and hedges are not overgrown in public areas.

Under the 1980 Highway Act, a highway authority can enforce hedges and trees do not encroach the highway.

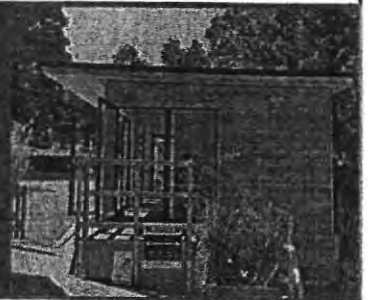

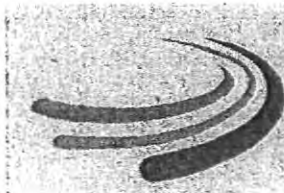
