Remembrance Sunday

Special mention must go to Tim & Dee of the Somerset Arms who laid on an after-service buffet. It gave those who were able to attend the opportunity to mingle and made the day complete.

Parish Council 10th November 2013

Parish Steward/Highways - The Clerk was instructed to report that the pavements are messy with lots of gravel etc and at the bridge the drainage is blocked and is now a danger to the traffic as they have to move out in to the middle now the road is becoming flooded.

Community Speed Watch Sid Deployment - Councillor Patrick Nixon reported that there will be a shared Speed Indicator Device coming to the parish in January. A site has been discussed and arranged. Councillor Patrick Nixon did try to speak with the team to say that he felt the site chosen was not preferable with the Highways Team, but they have set the site and not replied to his emailed concerns.

Swimming Pool – The Trustees and members of the Parish Council would like to ask the Parishioners in the community if anyone is interested in taking on the Swimming Pool as a Volunteer Group, to get in touch with either one of the Trustees, your local Parish Councillor or the Parish Clerk. There will be a six month period from December whereby if no one comes forward the future of the pool will be re- discussed at the May Parish Council meeting and the possible disposal of the pool will be implemented.

Insurance Company Risk Assessment - a quotation for £50.00 to bring in a specialist to value the Water Trough Memorial for Insurance purposes, as advised by Came & Company during their visit to check the Assets within the parish was agreed. Council also resolved the increase costs in the Insurance cover for the Bus Stop and Notice Board.

Policy Documentation – Council agreed to the implementation of the Equal Opportunities, Dignity at Work/Bullying and Harassment Policies the Clerk had produced.

Defibrillator Project – **Defibrillators Can Save Lives in Rural Communities.** Defibrillators are now located in bright yellow boxes in some rural communities to help save lives. You might have seen some in Mere when over that way. The code to access these devices is given out via the 999 service. Each unit costs £1950.00 plus installation costs. Most are accessible 24 hours a day. They are mounted on external walls and need a power source to keep them operable. Each time one is used the pads need to be replaced at a cost of £36. These particular units are suitable for adults and children and the units talk the user through the process of using it with diagrammatic displays to help.

The Parish Council wishes to install a defibrillator near the village shop as the time for an ambulance to reach a casualty in this rural area can be lengthy. If you have access to the Internet do check on the link listed below to this short film to hear what the Pewsey butcher who has implemented a similar project has to say -

A letter asking for donations toward this extremely important project have been sent out with this edition of the parish news. Please do read and take action to help this project take off.

Historical Listing re Parish Plan- Under the Parish Plan 2005 Actions re Conservation and Restoration it states: "The Parish Council was asked by the community to undertake a review of items identified in need of restoration work and/or favoured for on-going monitoring including. Listing and Prepare a detailed action plan." Background below, for those of you who might not know, what is and what isn't listed in the parish.

There are 19 listed buildings; the 19 listed buildings mainly cluster around 4 locations, All Saints Church, Church Street, Bradley House and Priory Farm. All Saints Church is the only Grade

1 listing, dating from the 12th century. Within the church yard the Healle, Messiter and Archer monuments are Grade 2 listed. A number of Church Street buildings are Grade 2 listed. These are house numbers 12, 20, 21, 25 and 26 on the east side and on the west side the Old Vicarage, Old Dower house (formerly Seymour House) Old Manor House and House number 27 and 28. A large part of Bradley House and surrounding buildings of Bradley House are Grade 2 listed. Priory Farmhouse, cowshed and farm buildings are grade 2 listed; the cowshed and farm building incorporating the remains of the Augustinian Priory.Other listings (all Grade 2) are Grange farmhouse, Perry Farm house and the cast iron County Boundary marker (Wiltshire/Somerset) on the road bridge at the junction to Horningsham.

A few other structures that were seen as features most frequently mentioned on personal lists for restoration and protection but are not listed are the Knapp and Fountain, Village Hall, Somerset Arms, Village Shop and Bradley House walled Garden and Greenhouses.

The Actions in the Parish Plan state that the Parish Council is to initiate approaches to see if some more valued features (e.g. Fountain, Village Hall mural) can be listed. So there is a need to identify and action a photographic record of all the listed buildings within the parish and those that might require listing in the future.

A parishioner has kindly agreed to take this action on behalf of the Parish Council. The parishioner will be given a letter from Parish Council giving details of the actions of the parishioner on behalf of the Parish Council explaining the project and that photographs will be taken of the outside of properties only. The Clerk will supply a Hi Viz safety jacket and a Risk Assessment so that the parishioner is correctly covered by health and safety for the requirements of the Parish Council Insurance Company. The Parish Council hope that the community will support this parishioner in his actions.

CPRE Best Kept Village Competition – The Parish Council have agreed to take part in the possible pilot for a BBC 2 filming of a documentary on village competitions. Councillors would email the Clerk details of events and possible parishioners for the company actioning the pilot to speak to.

Items for the next Agenda: Precept Budget

Date of the next meeting- The Council agreed that Tuesday 10th December 2013 would be the date of the next Parish Council meeting. The Parish Council Meeting will start at 7.30pm. All are welcome to attend.

As always, the Parish Council meeting will be open at the start with an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions or make comments on any matter. 


