Not many of us know what the responsibility of being a Parish Councillor entails. It is not until one becomes a Councillor is it fully understood,


but we should be grateful to those who take on this role and manage the Civic duties on behalf of the village.


#### News from the Memorial Hall

#### Parish Council December 2016

**Parish Steward Scheme** –the Community Pay Back team have agreed to look at painting the church street railings in the New Year. The Parish Steward has been asked to action hand clearing and cutting of growth from drainage grips and drain gully covers. Hand clearing of blocked drainage gullies, culverts, pipes and pits and the clearing storm debris from the roads and footways in the parish.

Any issues found by parishioners still need to be reported using the Wiltshire Council app or online at<u>http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/parkingtransportandstreets/roadshighwaysstreetcare/mywilts</u> <u>hirelogin.htm</u>

If any Parishioner sees or is aware of anything which they feel needs attention in and around the parish highways, they are requested to contact Wiltshire Council using either the online website, the Wiltshire Council App or on the landline number 0300 456 0105.

#### Scottish & Southern Electricity Works

They are approaching Parish Councils in the Wiltshire/Hampshire area to try to ascertain the level of people within the parish that may require a little extra help or assistance should the parish suffer a power outage in the forthcoming winter months. Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks is looking to highlight those people within the parish that would need assistance and ask them if they would like to be registered with them so they can come out and ensure they are looked after during a sustained outage. It is a free service, and any information provided is strictly confidential.

The company work closely with the Council and together have registered many people in the last 12 months but they are aware there are many more vulnerable people that are not registered. Those people they have registered will now be highlighted to the team should there be a power outage affecting them. They will ensure that every effort is made to support them and where possible provide assistance from generating their house to offering hot meals, drinks and reassurance. In addition their Emergency Service Centre will call them during the outage, checking they are ok and giving them updates on the estimated time of power restoration.

Registration is quick and simple to do and parishioners are encouraged to make contact. It can be done online, on the phone. Call 0800 294 3259 If you are calling from a mobile call 0345 072 1900 or 0800 316 5457 for text phone or on www.ssepd.co.uk/PriorityServicesRegister

You are eligible to join our Priority Services Register if you: QQ Are dependent on electricity for home medical care, for example a kidney dialysis machine. QQ Have a chronic illness or short term medical condition; for example you are recovering from a major operation. QQ Are disabled. QQ Have special communication needs; for example because you are blind, partially sighted, deaf or hard of hearing. QQ Have a young baby. QQ Receive a state pension.

We recognise there are other areas where our customers need support during power cuts. If you have other needs and feel you will need extra help if you have no electricity, please contact us to discuss. We can't promise your electricity will never go off, but when it does, we want to do what we can to make sure you have the support you need, when you need it.

**Items for the next Agenda:** 2017/2018 Budget, Election process for May 2017, PAYE payment due, Litter pick dates, Action Plan and request feedback on the condition of the rights of way.

**Date of the next meeting-** The Council agreed that Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2017 would be the date of the next Parish Council meeting.

As always, the Parish Council meeting will be open at the start with an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions or make comments on any matter. 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
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
