Maiden Bradley's Roman Lady

In August 1965, during excavations for a swimming pool, a stone sarcophagus was discovered in the grounds of Bradley House. Inside the green sand sarcophagus was a lead coffin containing a skeleton. There were no grave goods and the coffin was orientated north-south.



The Duke of Somerset put the skeleton in its coffin on display in the church. In 2010 the skeleton was examined and found to be of a young woman aged about 25-35 years old who had lived sometime between 253-408 C.E. The coffin that she was buried in would have been very expensive and the lady's bones confirmed that she had led a leisured life.

On Monday July 7th at 2pm our Roman lady will be reburied in the churchyard with a public ceremony to mark the event and there will be a small exhibition in the church.

Parish Council 13th May 2014

There is still a vacancy for a Co-opted Councillor to come on board and join the Parish Council Team of 7 Councillors.

What does it do? A Parish Council builds bus shelters to stop you getting rained on, maintains and provides the play areas to have fun with your children, campaigns for affordable housing so the younger people can stay in the village, provides lifesaving equipment, can act as the lead body for the establishment of a neighbourhood development plan, comments on planning applications; these are but a few of the items Council works on or can work on.

What, How and When? The Council meets once a month on the second Tuesday through the year except for August when it takes a break. The meetings last for an hour and a half to two hours in total. The meetings are held at 7.30pm in the village hall. Documentation for discussion is sent out by the Clerk to team members 5 days before a meeting, so you have time before the meeting to consult with other parishioners and make your mind up on issues presented.

Training? Training is available along with help from a Mentor Councillor, the Clerk and an extensive library of information the Clerk holds.

Neighbourhood Watch – There is also still a vacancy for the post of Neighbourhood Watch Representative for the parish. If you would be interested in taking on this post not only would you be representing the Community but helping coordinate issues from the Rural Policing Unit. The Rural Policing unit have one meeting every 3 months in Bishopstrow Village Hall with the other representatives in the area. It is a very friendly meeting with everyone working together. They have an email warning system re incidents in the area and it can be a very rewarding position. Parish Steward/Highways – the Clerk was instructed to report to the Community Co-ordinator that at the Crossroads looking from High Street to Bruton road, the drain on the left hand side is full of rubbish and the whole area requires a deep clean. Councillor Patrick Nixon is to meet with the Community Co-ordinator to highlight any work required for the Community day. If you know of any areas of the parish that require the attention of the Parish Steward please contact Wiltshire Council on 0800 232 323 or email Clarence@wiltshire.gov.uk or contact the Clerk direct.

Knapp Fencing - It was agreed that the fencing needs to be in place. It was decided that historically cars and lorries have been parked on the Knapp edge and caused issue, hence the fence came about. The question re the use of Oak or regenerated fencing was discussed. The use of pine with metal brackets so that they slot down with the use of spikes in the ground so there is not a rot problem at the bottom was suggested and agreed. The cost will be approx. £23.00 for every 6 ft of fencing required. The parishioner who had agreed to help with the project will meet with Councillors to decide the final action required and will come to Council with the final costs.

Forces March Event - it was noted that there was a different organiser this year; they had sadly left the recreational area in a mess. Thanks were given to the Chairman for rolling the area to aid access for the Village Show. It was felt that the Forces March use of the recreational area would need careful consideration next year. Clerk to email the photos to the Forces March organisers highlighting the destruction they had left.

Frome Town Council - The Clerk had been invited to attend the Frome Annual Council Meeting at the Assembly Rooms and was warmly welcomed. The Frome Clerk had indicated joint working on future initiatives between the town and parish council, apprenticeships, training, public transport and maybe collective purchase of energy were subjects he felt are worth thinking about. The Clerk had been asked to meet up at a later date; Council agreed that the Clerk attend such a meeting.

Website Update – Council felt that it was happy with the format of the website and agreed that the Clerk linked the Facebook pages to it. It was suggested that the Frome Football Team might also like to be linked to both the website and Facebook pages. It was agreed that the Clerk would start feeding more information onto the Facebook pages from the various groups that feed to the Clerk local and national information.

Woodland Trees Trust – Council noted the Clerk had actioned the trees trust application online and had been informed that the Parish Council will be informed as to whether it is successful in receiving a free tree pack in early September 2014.

Date of the next meeting- The Council agreed that Tuesday 8th July 2014 would be the date of the next Parish Council meeting. As always, the Parish Council meeting will be open at the start with an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions or make comments on any matter. Recipe - Summer Baked Spiced Peaches

2 fresh, ripe peaches, halved and stones removed Pinch of ground cinnamon or nutmeg 4 tablespoons fromage frais

2 teaspoons Demerara sugar iuice of half a lemon selection of summer berries to garnish (redcurrants, raspberries or strawberries)

Preheat the oven to 200c or gas mark 6. Cut each peach in half and ease out the stone. Place the peaches, cut side up. on a non-stick baking sheet. Sprinkle them with a little Demerara sugar, cinnamon or nutmeg and a few drops of lemon juice. Bake the peaches in the pre-heated oven for 15 - 20 minutes, until tender and golden brown on top. Serve the peaches warm, topped with a spoonful of fromage frais and a few of the summer berries. Quark or Greek voghurt can be used instead of the fromage frais.




