

All Saints' Special Service for Sea Sunday

Have you ever wondered where so much of our food comes from? Not to mention fuel, medicines, fridges and TVs. They arrive in this country in container ships, some of which are $400 \text{ metres long (around } \frac{1}{4} \text{ mile})$. 90% of world trade is done by sea.

We probably don't very often think of the men – and less often, women – who crew these ships. They are often treated very badly, abandoned on their ships without pay and often with no water, food or fuel. Without money they have no means of getting home and can't contact anyone for help because they don't have mobile phones.

These are the people the Mission to Seafarers helps. It is there for seafarers in tragedy and crisis, visiting ships and running seafarers' centres. It offers practical support: food, clothing, use of mobile phones and so on and it needs our support to enable it to continue this vital work.

July 12th is Sea Sunday. Why not come along to church on that day as we remember and pray for the work of the Mission to Seafarers? Jesus said, 'truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' This is our opportunity to help those who are so much less fortunate than ourselves and yet without whom we could not lead our comfortable lives. Next time you drive your car, or watch TV or eat imported food, please remember them.

Public phone box update: The Parish Council wish to inform Parishioners that when it turned down the request by British Telecom to adopt the telephone box near the bus stop in Maiden Bradley it discussed the following considerations:

In adopting the phone box the telecommunications unit inside of the box would be removed leaving the parish with no landline emergency phone line. Although there is a limited provision by the mobile telecommunications provider 02 within the parish, all mobile providers allow 999 calls from any provider to be made in that area of cover and so piggy back on their system, so there would be an emergency call system in place if it did adopt the phone box.

British Telecom. If there is another phone box within 400 metres BT can remove a phone box without the need for consultation. If there isn't another phone box within 400 metres then they have to consult with the relevant body. So BT are unable to remove the phone box without consultation though Wiltshire Council and with the community. The consultation process can be found at http://stakeholders.ofcom.org.uk/binaries/consultation/uso/statement/removals.pdf

The Parish Council could not see any use which the box might have if it was adopted. The defibrillator was thought to be in the best accessible position and safest position under the watch of the shop security system and using its electricity. The defibrillator can be used by anyone and does not need a phone call to the emergency services to be activated.

Under the contract between the Parish Council and BT additional health and safety checks would be needed weekly and the Council would be required to arrange cleaning of the phone box. A contractor would also have to be employed to paint and maintain the phone box due to the leaded paint already used: volunteers could not be used as the leaded paint brings health and safely risks for those painting the unit.

As the phone box without the telecommunications unit is valued at £4805.00 the Parish Council would be responsible for insuring the phone box at a cost of about £50 per year. To cover the cost of replacement parts, maintenance and cleaning costs the Risk and Contingency budget would have to increase by about £700.

The Parish Council hopes that parishioners will understand why it decided in 2008 and again in 2015 not to adopt the telephone box; and that until BT decide to seek permission for its removal the phone box and its landline will remain in its present position.

Mobile Library Service Parish Council Consultation 2015 - Wiltshire Council are consulting on the Mobile Library Service. The service would be withdrawn from Maiden Bradley due to the low usage it received. (Wiltshire Council were withdrawing stops with less than 3 customers using the service) Council did appreciated that Wiltshire Council are having to make savings. It did appreciated though that it was making available a Home library service which will be offered to those parishioners who are unable to access the library because of a disability, frailty or ill health and have none to visit on their behalf. This would be arranged via the consultation paper and those users would be informed by the library Service. The hope by advertising this information in the Parish News, those who used the service would have a further reminder to be aware of the withdrawal.

Recipe Victoria sandwich

8 oz softened butter 8 oz caster sugar 4 eggs 8 oz self-raising flour 1-2 tbsp water or milk Raspberry jam

Heat the oven to 180F/160F (for a fan oven)

Brush two sandwich tins with oil and line the base with parchment paper. Cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Whisk the eggs and add to the mixture slowly, adding a little sifted flour if the mixture looks as if it will curdle. Fold in the rest of the flour adding the milk or water to



produce a soft dropping consistency and then divide the mixture into the two cake tins. Place in the pre-heated oven and cook for 20 to 30 minutes until golden brown. When cooked and cooled spread the raspberry jam on one cake and sandwich both together, then sprinkle caster sugar on the top.







