

#### Parish Council June 2016

**Weight limit correspondence** – correspondence received from Dr Andrew Murrison, between himself and The Right Honourable Patrick McLoughlin MP, Mr Philip Whitehead Cabinet member for Highways and Transport and David Brewer, Executive Director Highways England, on the HGV 7.5 ton weight limit and the A350/303 junction was noted. Council was sadden that it takes statistic of accidents and deaths for swift action to occur but noted that the work on the junction was still under discussion. A copy of the correspondence can be obtained from the clerk.

Parish Steward Scheme – The Parish Steward Scheme is to be reinstated by the new Highways contractors Ringway. The Contract starts in October and the Parish Council will be able to highlight to the Parish Steward areas it wishes work to be actioned. #### Guinness Record Holder Matti Hemmings awards Bike-it Plus winners.

Matti Hemmings - professional flatland BMX rider and Guinness World Record holder - visited pupils at Whitesheet Primary Academy in Zeals as the spectacular finale to their 'Bike-it PLUS' Ride and Stride Competition.

The benefits of cycling had been the subject of posters produced by the children as part of the Ride and Stride Competition. The winners were presented with their individually named banners by Matti displaying their exciting designs. The BMX-er then enter-



tained the children with some amazing stunts and tricks. The children were enthralled.

After watching Matti's display the children got a chance to safely try out some stunts themselves - which was a fantastic introduction to this exciting sport.

Matti talked through the ups and downs of BMXing to the gathered children. One child, Ethan exclaimed, 'Mattie has helped me realise that learning from your mistakes is very important'.

'Bike It PLUS' promotes active travel to school through fun, practical, educational activities and events. The project was run by the sustainable transport charity Sustrans in partnership with Public Health at Wiltshire Council and the Wiltshire Healthy Schools programme

Since 'Bike It PLUS' began in Wiltshire, regular cycling to school has increased by 11% and levels of regular scooting and skating to school increased by 16%. The number of pupils regularly being driven to school has decreased by nearly 10%.

#### MAIDEN BRADLEY VILLAGE SHOP


