

From the Vicarage

This year Heytesbury Deanery (our local group of churches) is having a Year of Prayer. We started recently with a visit from Brother Sam of Hillfield Friary near Dorchester. He is a "real life" holy man complete with habit, girdle (rope round his middle) and sandals, living in community with 6 brothers and lay people too. The Friary is a Franciscan Order following the teaching of St Francis of Assisi and is open, so takes visitors. I've been there several times and their welcome is warm and genuine. The brothers gather 4 times a day for prayer, starting at 7am for half an hour of silent prayer. Br Sam is the leader of the community but he also takes a hand in cleaning, cooking and preparing accommodation for visitors together with planning and organising the direction of the community.



There was a real sense in listening to Br. Sam that here was a man very much in touch with God. His very presence was an encouragement to pray, even before he opened his mouth. Most people pray at some time in their lives, it can be a spontaneous expression of need or just joy. It is my experience that God answers prayer though not always in the way we would think. Maiden Bradley is blessed to have a midweek prayer group which meets every week to pray for the Village, for those in need both locally and further afield. (Celia Blay can give you details 844817). Parish Council February 2016

Litter Pick – The litter pick will be the 5th March 2016, meet at 10.00am at the community Garden where equipment to litter pick and Hi Viz Jackets supplied. There will be Councillors collecting the filled bags and assisting where required.

This is the weekend highlighted for the countrywide project Clean for the Queen's birthday.

Highways - Councillor Patrick Nixon reported that he had spoken to the Parish Stewart in the parish last week as they were actioning basic clearing. He reported the good news that Ringway have been reinstated as the Wiltshire Council Highways Contractor. It was noted that it might take until August 2016 for the company to settle in.

Councillor Sebastian Seymour reported that a road plough is need to get the back lane/Kingston lane back to its original width. The clerk was instructed to log this issue on the Wiltshire Council system. The recent flooding issues were discussed, it was felt that the level of flooding down Kingston lane was less than in previous years, Councillors would continue to monitor the issue. Councillor Patrick Nixon reported that the Fly tipping reported in Frome road layby, has been collected. It was noted that several Caravans have been dumped in the area but have been swiftly collected for disposal.

In the last newsletter, Melanie Collins talked about the birth of her baby and wanted to know of any other Maiden Bradley home births, so I thought I would tell you what know about my birth.

was the fifth child in the family. My other brothers and sisters had all been fairly straight forward births but things were not going well with this labour at our home in Frow Lane (off Frome Road) on a cold wet night in 1951. One of the family was despatched to the phone box in Church St (a home phone was a rarity in those days) to summon Dr. Ellis. When the doctor arrived he found that mother was in a bad way and that I was upside down and backwards (a state that has continued ever since, some might say!). Mother's brothers and sisters were called to the house as the doctor thought that neither she nor I would survive, but a miracle must have happened as mother pulled through and I eventually emerged in the early hours of 2nd November. After such an ordeal, mother asked Dr. Ellis to name me. As we lived "down the lane" he decided to name me after the little boy in the nursery rhyme, Christopher Robin. Mother obviously wasn't deterred by this bad experience though as she went on to have a further four children at home!


supplies though!

The Appliance of Science - at Whitesheet Academy.



Whoosh, Bang, Fizz and Pop were the names given to the four groups of children taking part in Whitesheet Primary Academy's Science Day. Each of the groups were accompanied by members of staff or governors. "It was difficult to tell who was the most excited," said Mel Vincent class teacher science subject leader, "them or the children!"

Live experiments and demonstrations continued throughout the day. These included such fascinating subjects as Candle Vacuum Demonstration, Make

a hoop out of A4 paper, Lava Lamp Demonstration, Milk Kaleidoscopes, Marsh Mallow Structures, Ooblick and Rockets, Chemistry – chromatography and PH value, Electricity – Build and test your own Circuits, Volcano Explosions, Centre of Gravity, Paper Structures and Flowers in Water. "The children were totally adsorbed in learning so many new, interesting and worthwhile ideas." said Mel Vincent, "It really was the appliance of science for the children".

All the experiments went according to plan - and there were plenty of oohs and ahs throughout the day. All the groups were of mixed years, with siblings together. This enabled the older children to assist and guide the younger ones.

"It was such a fantastic day." said the science leader at the end of the day. "All the children were so well behaved and excited. The team of children, staff and governors worked so well together giving such a vibrant and enthusiastic learning experience. It was truly Whoosh, Bang, Fizz and Pop!"

The children clearly had a very good day. Here's what some commented afterwards.

"My favourite activity was setting off the rockets. I learned to wait for the gasses to fill the chamber before it popped, it was so much fun"

"I really enjoyed the structure building with marsh mallows and also watching the oil separate from the water when making lava lamps. I learned that the oil is lighter than the water."

"I liked it when the volcano exploded. I learned that bicarbonate of soda fizzes when it is mixed with vinegar, red paint and washing up liquid. It looked like a real volcano"

"My favourite experiment was the lava lamp experiment. It was nice to look at because the water was coloured and the bubbles went through the oil"

"I loved the oozy gloop. I learned that if you mix corn flour and water together you can make a solid and a liquid. It felt really gooey."

"I loved the blast off rocket it went higher and higher. It was fun shouting 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, ZERO! Blast off!"

This Month's Recipe

Ingredients for Bang Bang Chicken

• 2 shallots, finely sliced

35g/1¼oz chopped fresh coriander

1 cooked chicken breast, shredded

• ½ lime, juice only

• 1 garlic clove, crushed

1 tsp sesame oil

1 tsp soy sauce

• 25g/1oz cashews, toasted

• 1 tbsp vegetable oil

• 2 pak choi leaves, shredded

1 lime, halved, to garnish

Method

- 1. Mix the shallots, coriander and chicken breast in a bowl.
- 2. In a mini blender, blend the lime juice, garlic, sesame oil, soy sauce and toasted cashews.
- 3. Place into a frying pan and cook gently until golden. Toss the sauce with the chicken salad.
- 4. Heat the vegetable oil in a wok and stir fry the pak choi for one minute.
- 5. To serve, pour the warm salad onto the pak choi leaves on a large plate and garnish with lime halves.
