

I give to my mother Alice Horde one annuity of 4 markes by the year paid quarterlie....

Youngest daughters Edith, Grace and Dorothie 200 markes apiece towards their marriages ...

Two youngest sons William and John ... shall have towards their exhibition 20 markes a year ...

Son Thomas ...furnace (?)... so as he will bestow 40 shillings upon a new for my wife. I give him more my yotinge stone (?) and the greatest cheaste in my chamber.

Dawley manor descended along with Harlington, which John Lovell is also thought to have acquired, to his son Thomas. As a result of conveyances in 1465, in which Reynold Barentyn of Oxfordshire was also concerned, Dawley apparently passed to Robert Oliver, who was said to be lord in 1428. He and his wife held the manor for life in 1448, but John son of Thomas Lovell quitclaimed it to Robert Aubrey in 1450, and similar quitclaims were made by Richard Brown, who seems to have held Lovell's interest in Harlington manor. Robert Aubrey of Dawley was collector of a subsidy in 1453 and died in 1488, leaving several sons. By 1515 Dawley belonged to Richard Aubrey. Thomas Aubrey held it in 1540 and William Aubrey in 1547. John Aubrey died in possession in 1557 and was succeeded by his son William. William Aubrey appears to have conveyed Dawley to William Roper, lord of Harlington, in 1564, but he was still living at Dawley in 1571, when he secured a lease of Harlington rectory. The manor seems to have belonged in 1590 to Richard Reynolds



Now I hereby and by virtue of the said last mentioned surrender give and devise unto my son William Foakes the said cottage and acre of arable land to hold unto my said son William Foakes and his heirs according to the custom of the said manor subject nevertheless unto and chargeable with the payment of the sum of £30 unto my executor hereinafter named within 12 months next after my decease.

Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth the wife of Robert Gilbert and Alice the wife of William Dowding the sum of £50 each to be paid to them respectively by my executor hereinafter named within one month next after my decease.

Also I give and bequeath unto the said Sarah Rickson the sum of £20 to be paid within one month next after my decease and I also give her the use of my household goods and furniture for and during the term of her natural life and from and after her decease my will and meaning is that the said household goods and furniture should be appraised and sold and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided between three of my children namely the said John Elizabeth and Alice except a furnace lately set up which after the decease of the said Sarah Rickson I give and bequeath unto my said grandson William Foakes and as to all the rest residue and remainder of my money securities for money goods chattels and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever I give and bequeath the same unto my son John Foakes and do hereby make nominate and appoint him sole and only executor of the my last will and testament.



And all the rest residue and remainder of my goods chattels rights credits and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever whereof or wherein I shall may be possessed or entitled at my decease after payment of all my first debts legacys and funeral expenses I give and bequeath unto my said son Thomas Foot and Elizabeth my said wife their executors administrators and assigns equally to be divided between them share and share alike and do hereby make and appoint them joint executors of this my said last will and testament revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made in witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

The mark of Thomas Foot '+' signed sealed published and declared by the said Thomas Foot the testator as and for his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request in his presence of each other have subscribed the same as witnesses - Joseph Foot - William Foot - Jn Brickle.

Proved 12th August 1788 at Sarum in the presence of Thomas Foot surviving executor.

Note - Mullen's (or Mullin's) Mill at Donhead St Mary was demolished between 1840 and 1886. It was one of three fulling mills in the village in 1606.





Francis Rogers Gray, the son of Francis Rogers?

* 1789 Francis Rogers Gray baptised to Dinah Gray, does not mention 'base born' but neither do any others in these parish records at this time but it is quite certain that he was. I think that the the burial on 25/4/1789 of a Francis Rogers is almost certainly his father. It was not uncommon practice to use the surname of an maternal or paternal branch as a child's second name and in this case it is almost certainly more than coincidence that Dinah Gray worked for Francis Rogers at the time that Francis Rogers Gray was conceived and later born.

Dinah probably lived at the Rogers house at Wickwood Farm in Tisbury and is a witness to Francis Rogers' will made in 1787 and proved 1792. She made her mark of a 'x' and is noted as his servant.

I had previously believed that this Francis Rogers buried in 1789 was Francis Rogers junior born in 1759. It seemed more likley that a young son had been Francis Rogers Gray's father. However the Rogers grave at Tisbury (see under Rogers) clearly says that the younger Francis died in 1783 aged 25, 6 years before Francis Rogers Gray was born. Therefore the father of Francis Roger's Gray, if one accepts the name linkage, is most probably Francis Rogers the 68 year old married farmer or at least one of his other sons.

The name 'Rogers' continued into the Hiscock family and the son of Edwin Hiscock and Anne Gray was called Francis Rogers Hiscock. Again this is probably more than just recognition of a previous family employer but most certainly testament to the name of the natural father of Francis Rogers Gray.

There is no evidence that Dinah had to rely on parish relief and was probably provided for by the Rogers family, although not directly in the will of Francis Rogers which was produced before Francis Rogers Gray was conceived and born. Maybe Francis' widow, Philippa, provided for mother and newborn son? Whether this arrangement was reached amicably and whether Philippa accepted the parentage of young Francis Rogers Gray, one can only speculate at.

Dinah later married another farmer called Alexander Godwin who would then have taken responsbility for raising young Francis.

Francis Rogers Gray certainly made a healthy living as a dairyman in Tisbury and later as a farmer at East Stour as is shown by the decent sized farm he held at Stour and the large tombstone at East Stour church. He may have been set up in this living by the Rogers family and/or his adoptive father Alex Godwin.



I believe that the wife of Edward Bown was in fact Hannah Haime and was buried 1822 age 89, born 1723 and baptised Holy Trinity to Thomas Haime in 1725.

Whitchurch Methodists: The Story so Far by Alison Deveson 2012

"... Haime had spent a short time in Andover in the 1760's and in the final years of his life came to oversee the Methodist society at Whitchurch where he died in 1784. We do not know how long he actually spent here but his ministry was building on the foundations of Wesley had laid. His second wife Catherine outlived him by 24 years and stayed in Whitchurch setting up business as a baker".

1766 - Susannah noted as wife of John. No record of a Susannah marrying any other John Haime or a burial of another John Haime in Shaftesbury at this time.

5/3/1705 John son of Richard Haymes baptised Shaftesbury Holy Trinity but he was buried 11/3.

2/4/1706 John son of Thomas Hayme buried Shaftesbury St Peter (baptised 7/1/1704 SStP)

The only John that could have been the father on Ann in Shaftesbury at the time is the following John. There are a number of reasons why this link is very probable if not absolutely proven -

- * John Haime the preacher did have a wife and children,
- * John joined the army and left Shaftesbury in December 1739 therefore after Ann had been born two years before and baptised earlier that year,
- * John left Shaftesbury again in 1766 after being invited to Cornwall, his wife Susannah died earlier that year,
- * in 1888 Rose Morgan and James Kelly married at the Wesleyan Chapel in Shaftesbury. Rose was a direct descendent of John Haime the Methodist preacher on this line.

Story of John Haime (soldier and Methodist preacher) 1709-1766

John Haime (1678-1736)

1741 does not mention widow but it is the most likely possible wife of John.

John of 1678 was a gardener known as John junior. Daughter Frances buried Holy Trinity 1698.

Note that John W Haime in his book states that this John's burial was 1710 however the burial states 'John son of John' and the reference to the parent is normally the indication of an child burial not that of an adult. I believe the 1734 burial is therefore more likely.

John Haime (1634-1701)

1701 Alice noted as 'wife of John' and John died later that year in the same parish.

John was a miller of Mill Lane, Shaftesbury (later became Haimes Lane).

* - from this point geneological link to the Haymes of Gillingham is made by John Haime in his book 'Haimes - a Dorset family'.

John Haime (1598-aft 1634)

A John Haime in 1616 was a champion of Shaftesbury's rights and received a lawsuit against him (and others) for erecting sheep pens in Bleke Street. The struggle went on till a revised Charter under King Charles II in 1665.

Feb 1632 William son of John Haymes of Newbury.

1598 baptism of John Hayme says of Willielmus (latin) Hayme junior. From this is it reasonable to assume that there was a related William Hayme senior.

William Haime (bf 1566-1630)







- Brothers John and Robert Chettell the fact that John Michell had two brothers with the surname Chettell suggests that John's mother either married a Mr Chettell before or after John's father.
- Dorothe Awbrey the name Dorothe suggests at a link to Dorothe Mompesson, whom I believe to be her mother who must have died before 1579.
- Richard Mompesson John states that Richard was 'his nephew' I believe that John was Richard's uncle through his marriage to Richard's aunt Dorothe Mompesson (see below). There are two Richard Mompessons this could be who were both grandsons of Drewe Mompesson Richard son of Vincent or Richard son of William (the latter became a Knight).
- Mathew Mompesson there is only one Mathew Mompesson who this could be and he would also have been John's nephew through his deceased wife Mathew son of William Mompesson of Maiden Bradley. That being the case this suggests that the Richard above was Mathew's brother.

Death of a Miser

At the meeting of Wimborne Guardians yesterday the case of Thomas Morgan of Pentridge, Cranborne, who died in the workhouse on Thursday was brought under notice, the deceased having been admitted on Tuesday in a starving condition and supposed to be utterly destitute of friends or means of support. On searching his house however, of which he had been the sole occupant for several years, the sum of £78 in gold was found in a box concealed beneath his bed. Since the discovery a great number of persons have come forward claiming to be relatives of the deceased. Morgan has been in receipt of parish relief for five or six years; but the guardians can only claim for one year. It is stated that Morgan is the last of a family of five or six brothers, all of whom lived and died in a similar way.



- In <u>'Bound to the Soil, a social history of Dorset' by Barbara Kerr</u> There is reference to a James Rymond age 29 from Tollard Royal being sentenced to 2 years hard labour (at Dorchester 10-12 January 1831). For machine wrecking at Sixpenny Handley.
- In '<u>Wiltshire Machine Breakers, Volume 2, by Jill Chambers, 1993'</u> There is reference to two others both sent to Devizes New Prison for 12 months in 1830 for destroying a thrashing machine belonging to Charles Lane at Tollard Royal. They were -
- Samuel Rymond, aged 22, born 16/6/1805 Sixpenny Handley, Dorset parents Joseph and Ann Riman
- Thomas New, aged 24, married to Ann Ryman from Woodcutts in 1827, Sixpenny Handley, Dorset
- Samuel Riman was Edward's (my great x4) grandfather's cousin and Thomas New was married to Samuel's sister Ann Riman. No direct link found yet to James of Tollard. Given that many male agricultural labourers in Handley were involved in this riot (50-60 men) it is difficult to believe that given relatives were convicted, that Edward was not

amongst the crowd that attacked equipment on three farms in the area in November 1830.

Children of Edward and Sarah Riman at Handley - 1831 Charles (m 1859 Handley, Harriet Hardy), 1833 James (m 1853 Sarah Chown, Handley), 1837 George (m Emily), 1840 Mary Ann/Margaret, 1845 Fanny, 1852 Edwin.

1830 marriage of Edward Raymond of Handley and Sarah Whitemarsh at Tollard Royal by banns witnessed Isaac Green and Elizabeth Whitmarsh

William Riman (1769-1828)

Children of William and Mary Riman at Handley - 1792 Joseph* (m 1823 Mary Answorth, Handley & 1823 Elizabeth White, Handley), 1794 William (m Anne), 1796 Robert (m 1829 Anne Whitmarsh, Tollard Royal), 1799 John **, 1809 Edward (m 1830 Sarah Whitmarsh) & Thomas.

- * Joseph was admitted to Herrison Hospital (asylum) in 1854.
- ** in 1821 John Riman, 21 of Sixpenny Handley, labourer, single was convicted of stealing a pair of gaiters, appearance 5'8", flaxen hair, gray eyes, fair complexion. 2 months hard labour.

Note - the 'flaxen hair' or 'sandy hair' description is typical of the male Rimans of this period.

1790 marriage says William Riman of Handley and Mary Grey of this parish, by banns, witnessed Elizabeth Thomas and Wm Adams.

1768 marriage at Sixpenny Handley of Robert Riman and Dinah Beach, by licence (no detail), witnessed Joshua Hardiman and Christopher Forward

* assumed from this point back but probable line.

The Sixpenny Handley parish records start from 1754 and therefore prior generations of Riman's before Robert will be unrecorded.

Robert Riman (bf 1732-aft 1765)

* assumed wife Mary based on date and location of her burial.

1765 Indenture

Robert Riman, yeoman of Woodcutts, entered into an indenture with Joseph Brockway of Shaftesbury on 14th April 1765.

The indenture refers to a deed / bond for a dwelling place at Parsons Pool in the parish of Holy Trinity in Shaftesbury

1760 will of William Adams of Handley

refers to Robert Ryman, yeoman of Woodcutts, Adam's son-in-law

Children of Robert Riman at Handley - ? Robert, 1745 (?) James (bur 1825 SH aged 80).

Joseph Riman (bf 1714 - 1755)

* assumed widow Elizabeth based on date and location of her burial.

Robert Riman (bf 1696 - 1731)

* assumed widow Ann based on date and location of her burial.

Win Kirby (nee Ryman) of Woodcutts

Win died aged 87 in December 2006 (born 1919). She was almost certainly a distant cousin having come from the same Riman family as that detailed above.

I don't know whether anyone descended from this line still lives in the hamlet or whether she was the last to do so.

However there are few other Robbins records in any other Shaftesbury parish at this time or subsequent Robbins burials meaning that Sarah must have come from elsewhere. Robbins (Robins) records in Shaftesbury -



The names John and James come from James' family. Sarah from herself leaving possible clues of Sarah's parents as Lucy, William or Martha.

1849 Francis Rogers Hiscock son of Edwin Gray and Anne Gray (Francis Rogers Gray's daughter) at Stour Provost, Dorset

Rogers graves in Tisbury Churchyard (grade II listed monuments)

Two large rectangular tombs on the right hand, front of Tisbury Church are those of the Rogers family.

The right hand tomb (as one looks from the road towards the church) and front left panel is to Francis son of Francis and Philippa Rogers.

Unfortunately the face is very warn but I can make out -

"In memory of Francis son of Francis and Philippa Rogers who died 18th March 1783 aged 25 years"

In front is a smaller darker stone tomb of John Rogers buried 1705 and wife Margaret.

Nicholas Rogers did not leave a will in Dorset or Wiltshire.

Land Tax Returns

1817 to 1830 - East Stour - Proprietor, Nicholas Rogers - Occupier, Sam Mells - premises charged - High Groves Farm*

* note that this is the very farm that Nicholas' probable illegitimate son, Francis Rogers Gray, held from 1831

Probable father of Francis Rogers Gray - see Rogers essay explaining this connection.

Probable child of Nicholas Rogers and Dinah Gray at Tisbury - 1789 Francis Rogers Gray

Francis Rogers (1720-1792)

John Rogers, Francis' son

In the 1805 Poll Book - John Rogers of Tisbury held a freehold at East Stower in the occupation of John Peters

This John was the son of Francis Rogers, and I believe was Francis Rogers **Gray**'s half brother. In the 1809 will of the gentleman William Hacker of Semley (William was John Roger's wife, Mary (nee Rixon)'s uncle), John Rogers is referred to as being a gentleman of 'Wickwood', Francis' old farm.

John and Mary had a son John in c 1785 who in his will 1844 refers to himself as an 'esquire' and he refers to local 'gentlemen' with whom he was friends.

In his will he also refers to other freehold estates at -

East Stour, Semley and Tisbury in Wiltshire and Dorset

A lot of this estate at Semley and his status appears to have come through his mother Mary and the link with her uncle the gentleman William Hacker.

In his will of 1844 this John Rogers refers to wife Eleanor, sons John, George and Brumhead (latter both under 21) and daughter Sarah

Baptisms of his children at Tisbury - 1830 John and 1836 (born 1832) Brumhead and Sarah (born 1835) Sarah - children of John Rogers, esquire and wife Eleanor

There is a gap between 1790 and 1830 in Rogers family references in Tisbury, between the baptism of Joseph son of John and Sarah Rogers and the first baptism of a child of John Rogers, esquire. This suggests that this may be a different Rogers family or at least one that moved away from Tisbury, only to return later with better fortune.

1804 East Stour Enclosure

Plots 154 and 179 sold to Nicholas Rogers

Plots 156 and 214 sold to John Rogers

Note - Both brothers and sons of Francis Rogers of Tisbury, half brothers of Francis Rogers Gray who also ended up owning land at East Stour.

Will of Francis Rogers, made 29/8/1787 and proved at Sarum 12/6/1792

Says he was of Wickwood Farm, Tisbury and a yeoman. Bequeaths -

to his beloved wife Philippa annuity of fifty pounds a year

to sons John Rogers and Nicholas Rogers appointed joint executors the remainder of money, stock, goods, chattel and effects.

Signed by Francis Rogers with his seal.

Witnessed by Dinah **Gray** with her mark, 'x', as servant to the testator.

Wickwood Farm, Tisbury - according to the owner of neighbouring Wick Farm (2008) these farms were owned by the Bennett family of Pythouse. If this was the case the Rogers family also, it appears from the note below, leased land from the Arundells of Wardour.

1781 and 4 leases (National Archives)

Henry Lord Arundell to Francis Rogers of Wickwood, Tisbury, yeoman; land described Spelsbury Lane, Tisbury

Children of Francis and Philippa Rogers at Tisbury - 1756 John (m 1783 Mary Rixon of Semley) (bu 1816, age 59, of Weekwood Farm'), 1759 Francis (bu 1783), 1761 Nicholas.

1761 - on the baptism of son Nicholas, Francis was of 'Wickwood'.

1756 Francis Rogers signed on his marriage and Phillippa gave her mark 'x'.

John Rogers (1689 - 1755)

Will of John Rogers of Tisbury made 21/2/1755

Weak of body but sounds of mind and memory. Bequeaths -

to son in law Matthew Combe sum of fifty pounds,

to daughter in law Mary Rogers and her four children one shilling a piece,

to son Nicholas one shilling,

to son in law Renalder Freake one shilling,

to granddaughter Mary Target five pounds when she is 21 years old,

all the rest and residue of goods and chattels to his loving wife and at her decease be equally divided between two sons Francis and Elisha,

makes his wife whole and sole executrix. Signed with his mark and seal.

Administration of 11/10/1757

States that Margaret Rogers, sole executrix of the above will died before being able to take the burden of execution. Son Francis Rogers takes possession of the property referred to in the will.

Signed by Francis Rogers with seal and Thomas King / Alexander Mercer.

Note no reference in the above administration of son Elisha Rogers.

1723 & 1730 baptisms of children to John Rogers 'of Week Wood (i.e. Wickwood Farm in Tisbury)'. Note - 'wick' in Anglo Saxon meant 'farm'. So 'Wickwood Farm' is Farmwood Farm!

Children of John and Margaret Rogers at Tisbury - 1713 John, 1717 Nicholas, 1720 Francis (m 1756 Philippa Coombes), 1723 Elisha* (m 1759 Tisbury, Mary Scammell), 1730 Mary (m Targett)

* - left a well dated 1790, he was a farmer in Tisbury and refers to sons John, William and James and daughters Mary and Elizabeth. Will witnessed by John Rogers, probably elder brother.

Wickwood inheritance - 1720 the inheritance of the farm passed from Nicholas Rogers to his nephew Nicholas, son of Nicholas senior's brother John. However Nicholas junior died the next year and it appears without an heir because Wickwood came into the ownership of Nicholas' brother John Rogers.

John Rogers (c1650 - 1705)

Will of Mary Rogers made 2/2/1718

Refers to sons John and Nicholas, daughters Elizabeth (born 1686) and Susana, children of daughter Mary (Mary born 1683) - John and William. Will proved 8/6/1720.

Will of John Rogers made 1/11/1705

Of Wick in Tisbury, sick in body but sound of mind and perfect memory. Bequeaths -

to Mary his wife fourty pounds and the bed that he now lys (sic) upon, warming pan, two boxes, tableboard and chamber in which he lyes (sic),

son John* fourty pounds when he is 21 and wearing clothes,

cousin William Rogers* a ? worth five shillings,

grandson John Adlem a? worth five shillings,

to Thomas Scammell thirty pounds which sum he promised and 'gave it under my hand as a portion (?) with my daughter Elizabeth',

to daughter Mary Adlem two shillings and six pence,

remainder of goods and chattels to loving **son Nicholas Rogers***, full and sole executor.

Signed by John Rogers with seal.

Inventory signed by Nicholas Rogers and another totalling 312 pounds 17 shillings and 6 pence mostly farm stock, cattle and crop.

Inventory £312 17 shillings and 6 pence total.

Gravestone at Tisbury churchyard -

On opposite side to the memorial to John and Margaret, "also of Francis and George sons of John and Mary Rogers"

Note - must have been children of John and Mary Rogers who did not survive to adulthood (not mentioned in the above will of 1705).

Children of John and Mary Rogers at Tisbury - 1684 Mary (m Adlem), 1686 Elizabeth (m Thomas Scammell), 1689 John, ? Nicholas (bu 1721) (m Susanna), ? Francis, ? George ? - see about for Francis and George and references on the gravestones, however I am now confident that they were sons of John and Mary as they do not appear in the will and no baptism exists, but then neither does it for Nicholas and he is confirmed as a son and surviving after 1705.

Wick was a settlement in the early 12th century near the site of the present Wick Farm. It may have been a hamlet in the late 14th century but was later a single farmstead:

c. 1700 Wick Farm was rebuilt and a new farmstead, Wickwood, was built between Wick and East Hatch. Both farmhouses survive, Wick with farm buildings of the 19th and 20th centuries, Wickwood with a 19th-century barn which was converted into a house in the late 20th century.

1720 Will of Nicholas Rogers

Made 6/7/1720. proved 25/7/1721. Yeoman of Tisbury. Refers to -

Sister-in-law Susan Rogers and her son William Rogers*.

Kinswoman Elizabeth wife of Thomas Scammell.

Kinswoman and servant Elizabeth Knight.

Kinsmen John and William sons of John Adlam.

Kinsman John Rogers*.

Sister Mary Widmore.

Rest and residue to Nicholas Rogers son of my late deceased brother John Rogers* - sole executor'.

Nicholas Rogers -

1709, 1712 & 1714 children John, William and Martha to Nicholas Rogers of 'Weekwood', however these children did not survive along, wife Susanna was buried in 1718 to Nicholas Rogers of 'Lawn' and in July 1721 when he was buried Nicholas is again referred to as 'of Lawn'. Poor Nicholas died alone having lost three children and a wife in short succession.

The above will proves the connection of Nicholas Rogers who was baptised 1648 to Nicholas Rogers and the John Rogers who died 1705, despite the lack of a baptism record for the latter. Further it links the line above of the Rogers of Tisbury to that of the line of Rogers of Mere. Nicholas Rogers who was baptised 1648 was the first Rogers record at Tisbury and his father Nicholas (son of gentleman William Rogers) was born at Mere. Links above in the wills of the two brothers shown in bold with an *.

Nicholas Rogers (c1630 - 1694)

1694 burial of Nicholas Rogers of West Hatch at Tisbury.

Children of Nicholas and Dorothy Rogers - 1648 Nicholas (Tisbury), 1656 Mary (Tisbury) (married Widmore), ? John, ? Katherine (bu 1664 Tisbury), ? son (married Susan)

Note - whilst Nicholas was baptised 1634 and married before 1648 (possibly making him 14) it is likely he was baptised later in childhood and Nicholas did use the name Mary for one of his children (probably for his mother Mary (nee Goddard)), there is no evidence of the burial of another Nicholas Rogers baptised 1634 in Mere either in childhood or adulthood, West Hatch is the Mere side of the Tisbury parish and the name William Rogers is used by his grandson John. I am therefore confident of this link between Nicholas Rogers son of William of Mere and Nicholas Rogers later of West Hatch in Tisbury.

1641 will of Alice Rogers of Mere

Made 8th January 1640. Widow. Bequeths -

To Anne Rogers daughter of son Thomas Rogers 'the bed whereon I now lie and all the bedding thereon belonging & two pair of sheets which are in my coffer ... my blacke stuffe gowne and my best stiroate.

To daughter Lydia one of the other daughters of son Thomas - one payre of sheets lying in the same coffer.

To Thomas son of son Thomas - one damashe table cloth, one little furnace panne & one other brasse panne on the greater ... & one ? panne standing in the chamber where I now lodge.

To godson Nicholas Rogers one draper table cloth of the better sort, my gold ring & my biggest furnace & my second best brasse panne.

To Avis Rogers the daughter of son William - my best cloth gowne & one draper table cloth of the lesser sort & half a dozen of pewter vessels.

To Margaret Rogers daughter of son William - one of the best brasse potts & half a dozen pewter vessels.

To Alice Rogers, daughter of son William - one flaggon pott.

To Dorothy Kendall daughter of brother Nicholas Kendall - my best hollon table cloth & my best hat stands at my beds foote.

To brother Nicholas Kendall - 5 shillings in gold & my middle table cloth gowne to Avis his wife.

To daughter in law Anne Rogers - one lymborke.

All the residue of my goods chattels whatsoever ... to William Rogers my said son, who is made sole executor.

Witnessed John Martyn and Henry Moncke.

Children of Thomas and Alice Rogers at Mere - 1598 Thomas, 1604 Alyce, 1603 William.

1607 will of Edward Rogers

Gentleman of Stourton. Refers to sons Edward and John (neither referred to as under age), also sons William and Thomas (both of whom are under age). Wife Alice.

Thomas and William Rogers were baptised at Stourton 1594 and 1597. Elder son John appears to have been baptised 1583.

1602 administration of Richard Rogers

Gentleman of Stourton. Refers to his son Edward Rogers.

A John Rogers married Margaret Astwicke at Stourton in 1578 and Katherene Rogers married Humfrey Victor the same year.



However that is probably too early to be the parents of the William having children 1673 onwards and I think the fact that William and Ann used the names Thomas and Thomsin shows the connection to Thomas Turner and Tomson Gray and therefore the William 'junior' probably refers to his uncle being William 'senior'.

William had a brother Thomas Burt who was sentenced to 7 years transportation for taking part in the riot of 1830 at Pythouse.

William was put in prison in 1840 for being unable to pay 1s 3d poor rate. A petition was presented to the House of Commons about his situation, some of which refers to his family -

"... employed as a day labourer in the parish of Fonthill Gifford, at wages of 9s per week; that he has a wife and five small children under 10 years of age, who are entirely

dependent upon his labour for their subsistence; that of the said sum of 9s per week he had to pay 1s per week for the rent of their house and garden which he occupies; that he and his wife are wretchedly clothed, and that his children are almost destitute; not one of them having a shoe to their feet. That during the past winter neither himself nor family have had more than half a bellyfull of the coarsest food, and that consequently he found it impossible to pay the poors'-rate charged upon him, without subjecting himself and family to absolute starvation..."

I give unto my son Samuel Vincent the sum of £120.

I give unto my son Soloman Vincent the sum of £87. I also give unto my said son Soloman my clock and case.

I give unto my daughter Jane now abroad the sum of £54 and in case she should not return to this country within the term of ten years from my decease I give the £54 so given to her unto her daughter Cecilia.

I give unto my daughter Harriet the amount deposited by me in her name with interest at the Shaftesbury Savings Bank.

I give unto my daughters Maria and Eliza the amount deposited by me at the Shaftesbury Savings Bank in the name of my daughter Ann with the interest due thereon in equal proportions. I give unto my daughter Maria the sum of £79 and to my daughter Eliza the sum of £68 to be paid to each of them within six months after my decease.

I also give unto my said daughters Harriet, Maria and Eliza a suit of mourning each.

In case my said daughter Jane or the said Cecilia daughter of the said Jane should not return to this country within ten years from the day of my decease then I give the legacy so given to them respectively who should not return within such period unto such children or their issue as may be living at the expiration of ten years as aforesaid such issue to take the parents share only in equal proportions.

I give unto Elizabeth Mullins and Sarah Burt daughters of the said Harriet the sum of £5 each.

I give unto Ann Stevens daughter of the said Harriet the sum of £1 and 10 shillings.

I give unto Maria Burt daughter of the said Harriet the sum of £1 and all the rest and residue and remainder of my personal estate and affects I give unto my three sons George Samuel and Soloman to be equally divided between them and of this my last will appoint them joint executors. In witness whereof I the said William Vincent the testator have hereunto set my hand this 19th day of January in the year of our Lord 1861. Witnessed by James Lush jr East Tisbury Wilts and William Honeyfield Gillingham Dorset.

This is a codicil to the last will and testament of me William Vincent of Salisbury late of Fonthill Gifford in the county of Wilts gardener which will bears the date the 19th

January 1861. Whereas in my said will I have given unto my son George the sum of £95 I do hereby further give and bequeath unto my son George all that freehold dwellinghouse and garden situate in Fonthill Gifford aforesaid and now in the occupation of Ambrose Bishop*. I also give unto my son George all that small plot of garden ground situate near the above formerly planted to fir trees and now in the occupation of James Ovens* and I declare that my said will shall accordingly be read and construed as if the legacies bequeathed by this codicil had been therein bequeathed to my said son George Vincent and in all other respects I confirm my said will. Signed William Vincent and witnessed William Henry Foot Salisbury Wilts and Thomas Osmond (10 police).

On the 8th day of May 1863 the will with a codicil of William Vincent formerly of Fonthill Gifford ... but late of the city of Salisbury gardener deceased was proved by the oath of George Vincent and Samuel Vincent sons of the deceased two of the executors named in the will having been first sworn duly to administer power being reserved to Soloman Vincent son also of the deceased the other executor named in the said will.

Effects under £800 no leaseholds. Probate extracted by George Vincent of Salisbury baker and Samuel Vincent of No 12 Bryanston Mews East Bryanston Square London coachman two of the executors.

* in 1861 Amos Bishop (blacksmith) and James Ovens (baker) were living at properties a few houses (Ovens three along) either side of the Police Station at FG.

One, called WITCHAMPTON, later COLEMAN'S farm, may have descended with Heddington Cauntelo manor from the 13th century, and in the earlier 15th century it was the inheritance of Agnes Watkins, a greatgreat-granddaughter of Maud de Cauntelo. In 1437 Agnes and her husband William Watkins settled it on William Witchampton and his wife Alice in tail. The estate evidently reverted to Agnes or her heir, her daughter Agnes Watkins (d. 1499), who married Drew Mompesson.

In 1238 Humphrey, earl of Hereford, gave the main part of the moiety to Roger de Cauntelo in an exchange, and conveyed what was probably a small part to John Rivers. Evidently after 1242 Rivers gave his land in Heddington to Lacock abbey for the maintenance of two chaplains, and the abbey presumably added it to Heddington manor. The main part of the moiety descended in the Cauntelo family. Robert de Cauntelo held it in 1316, and in 1329 it was held for life by Maud de Cauntelo with remainder to another Robert Cauntelo and his wife Joan. It passed to Robert and was held for life by his later wife and relict Maud (d. 1402). In 1402 the estate reverted to Robert's and Maud's granddaughter Elizabeth Cauntelo, the wife of Richard Cheddar, and in 1428 Richard (fl. 1431) held it by the courtesy. On Richard's death the estate reverted to Agnes, the great-great-granddaughter of Maud de Cauntelo (fl. 1329) and the wife of William Watkins. The Watkinses may have held it in 1437, and it passed to their daughter Agnes, the wife of Drew Mompesson (d. by 1488). On Agnes's death in 1499 the estate passed to her son John Mompesson, and on his death in 1511 it passed to his son Edmund ...

There is then a statement made 20th February 1735 (two weeks after his marriage) from Ambrose Whitmarsh stating that he was unwilling to take upon him the burden of executor and renounces claims in his father's will.

Inventory of the goods and chattels of the late Thomas Whitmarsh taken 12th August 1735 includes 200 sheep, 46 hogs, 5 pigs, calves an 'old cow', furniture, furnace and grate, butter barrels, clock and pewter, ironware, beds and bedding, furniture, wagons, farm equipment, wheat and crops in the field. Total value just over £283.
