Richard William G Stainer




Son of Richard and Sarah Stainer, great x 2 uncle (my grandfather Sidney Wareham's uncle).

Richard drowned on board HMS C11 on 7th July 1909 (aged 25) after the submarine accidentally collided with merchant ship SS Eddystone near Cromer in the north sea.

The submarine was never recovered and neither was Richard's body or the bodies of eleven of his colleagues. Out of a crew of sixteen, just three survived. The wreck is now a registered war grave.
