Groundsmanship Course There will be Level 1 spring Groundsmanship course at Dean Park on Sunday April 3rd 9 am to 4-30pm The subjects covered include preparation of the square, machinery, mowing, rolling, watering, scarifying and brushing, fertiliser application, preparation of the match pitch, after match repairs and renovation. D.C.A.50 + Nets



CRICKET FORCE 2005

Cricket Force is an initiative developed as part of the ECB's Natwest Volunteer programme 'Get Involved'. The ECB encouraging cricket clubs throughout England and Wales to undertake major renovations to their clubhouses and grounds. The scheme involves volunteers from the local community (i.e., members of cricket club, parents, etc) working together to make a major improvement on the look and feel of our clubs. The idea is for the clubs to appeal to local businesses in order to receive as much sponsorship and materials as they can. These materials will be used for jobs including painting, scraping and building new facilities to make the clubs safer and more comfortable .

The first national Cricket Force weekend will take place on 2nd and 3rd April 2005 for all focus Clubs, during this weekend the ECB are hoping to attract over 10,000 volunteers, making it the biggest volunteering event ever staged. The initiative was piloted at Cerne Valley Cricket Club in Dorset, the Club encouraged players and members of the community to support them by persuading businesses to donate materials, time and expertise. Members of the club and the public were also kind enough to offer their services and donate resources to the project. The following projects were tackled; new kitchen fitted-bar refurbished-toilets and pavilion painted new showers installed

The approximate value of the materials used was £3000 most of which were donated, mainly from the business community. Some of the local companies who have contributed to Cricket Force so far are B&Q, Ultra-Seal, Hankinsons, Tesco and Asda. In 2005 we expect a number of Companies to get involved.12 months after the first ever CricketForce, Lingfield CC reported an 83% increase in bar revenue, more juniors and seniors playing in teams, new sponsorships and community interest in the club is at an all time high, proving that partnerships between cricket, business and local people can really make a difference. As an extra incentive the Dorset Cricket Board are offering £50 towards ten projects judged to be the most needy. NatWest and the ECB are also offering resources to Clubs who register their event on the ECB website www.ecb.co.uk

Dorset needs more match officials

It's often said that the best umpire is the one you don't notice. The same is true of good scorers. We like to think that we go about our vital business with quiet efficiency, not showiness.

Our association – the Dorset Association of Cricket Umpires and Scorers (DACUS) – goes about its work in the same quiet way. In fact we are so quiet that it came as a pleasant surprise to be asked to contribute to this newsletter. We have a lot to report, as we do not hibernate as some players do in the winter. We have been hard at it in the close season, working with the national association (ACU&S), to raise the standard of match officials throughout the county. Our members have been busy instructing on the laws of cricket and on scoring techniques. The courses run by ACU&S are our principal source for recruiting new volunteers. Despite all this work, we still do not have nearly enough umpires and scorers to provide officials for every match in Dorset, especially at weekends.

This is a great shame as it is wonderfully rewarding work, even if exacting. Experienced umpires will tell you that watching the whole game from the middle is a different experience. They often tell me that they have, from their privileged position, scored more brilliant centuries and taken more wickets (in their heads, of course) than ever they did as players.

Anyone reading this who would like to join our ranks will be made most welcome. You will be joining a band of dedicated, experienced and above all friendly people. There are training courses every winter to guide new entrants through the laws in a structured way which gives you real confidence-building knowledge of the game.

A pre-entry course, recently introduced by ACU&S to give a brief insight into the delights of umpiring, was staged in Blandford in early February. It was run by Colin Sturmey and Mark Charles at the invitation of the DCB. We hope to put on more such courses before the start of the season.

I shall be suggesting ways of improving recruitment at the March meeting of the committee of DACUS. I believe it is the duty of everyone who loves the game to ensure that we attract more active match officials. Anyone interested in training to become an umpire should call Michael Hopkins on 01202 699586 and potential scorers should call Christine Drew on 01202 887712.

DACUS has had some changes over the winter. Mark Charles did not seek re-election so I, a relative newcomer to Dorset, have taken over as chairman. Christine Drew has taken up the treasurer's responsibilities from Steve Barrett and Brian Medler has replaced Bob McCrae as appointments officer.

CRICKET COACHING

The following statement should help to clarify any confusion with regard to the number of organisations offering cricket coaching and other cricket services .

The Dorset Cricket Board run a full programme of cricket within the County under the control of England and Wales Cricket Board. Courses for beginners, Club and school cricketers, district players and County are organised through the Dorset Cricket Centre by the County development officer and his team and are co-ordinated by the four districts in the North, South ,East,. and West. The Dorset Academy is run by the Dorset Cricket Board to prepare players for a possible first class career.any other organisations or bodies offering cricket coaching or other cricket related activities and do not carry the ECB logo and are not officially part of the County Board structure and therefore do not have a link to District, county and Academy pathways.

COACH EDUCATION

Any club with members wishing to take Level 1 or 2 coaching Qualification should note the following:-

Wed 23rd March Introduction to Net coaching 7pm to 10pm These two courses are required for the level 2 course.

All the above will all take place at the Dorset Cricket Centre.

First aid and child protection courses required for both of these will be notified to candidates registered on the Level 1 and 2.
