| Those attending broke up into 5 discussion groups: they considered four starter papers covering: | |
| Infrastructure; Local Services; Community; and, Village Character. | |
| Each group added further issues it felt important as well as removing perceived low priorities. Large paper sheets were used to record the points each group considered important: these were used to draw together key points at the end of the Workshop | |

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| Common issues and priorities quickly emerged as each group presented its key points: | |
| Community - The importance of the Church in the village community, alongside the Village Hall and the Royal Oak; Infrastructure - The high priority accorded by all to improving broadband and electronic communication generally; Village Services - The fundamental importance of the Parish Steward and the importance of road maintenance; Community - the need to play a full part in the wider local community, in particular in Tisbury, to maintain service such as local buses, and Tisbury Sports Centre; Development - the need for proportionate development in keeping with the South Wiltshire Strategic Plan, (which foresees only limited infill in the Nadder Valley villages), and the Village Design Statement, taking matters on their merits as they arise. | All |

| The Chairman thanked those attending for their enthusiastic and thoughtful contributions which would be invaluable for the next stage. The next steps would be: | |
| A short set of action notes to record the major points arising from the Workshop; Preparation of a first Village Plan for consideration and adoption by the Parish Council at its next meeting on Tuesday 21 September 2010 at 7.00pm; This Village Plan would become a working document for development as the Parish Council gained experience in use. It would be reviewed at each meeting and, in particular, would form part of the Agenda for the Village Annual Meeting in April; and, He encouraged villagers to attend the Parish Council's meetings so they might contribute their views. | GE All |
| The Chairman covered a number of routine matters, including forthcoming consultations on household rubbish collections, and harmonising parking charges across Wiltshire, which were important opportunities for people to express a view before closing the Workshop at 9.00pm | |
