### Hints and Tips

**HTML** - Hyper Text Mark-up Language. This is a programming language used to create web pages. The idea of WCW, is that anyone with little or no web design knowledge can create a site. This can mean that the templates used within the site may be too restrictive for you to produce your own style for your pages. This is where a bit of HTML can help!

#### Paragraph Returns

- This will add a line break between sections of text.
- To insert add the tag in the place where you would like the break

#### **Non-Breaking Soft Returns**

- A 'soft' return adds a return but no break
- To insert add the tag <br> in the place where you would like the break

#### **Scrolling Text**

- Adds scrolling text across your page
- To insert add the tag <marquee> to the section you would like to scroll.
- Also add an ending tag </marquee> where the scrolling text section should end
