

Promoting your site

Created a fantastic site and want to promote it more?

Then take a look at these tips for promotion and search engine recognition:

- Add your website address to your email signature
- Make sure all your members / colleagues etc know how to find your website and the address
- Add your web address to minutes / posters / leaflets etc
- Add a news item to your local area of WCW to let people know you have a site set up and when new pages and items are added
- Purchase your own domain name and re-direct it to your WCW site
- Get your site featured in the 'Spotlight' section of this newsletter
- Always complete the keywords and description boxes at the end of each page template – but keep these to a selective minimum
- Ensure your page content mentions these keywords
- If possible, use these keywords as part of your page title
- Ask external websites to add a link to your site e.g. your parent organisation and other local sites

 Keep your website fresh and up to date – new content ensures that search engines pick it up quicker

Spotlight on a Wiltshire Community Web Site





In May 2003 the Chalke Valley Sports Centre was opened, and in a meeting soon after that, it was decided to have a web site. After looking at different possibilities, it was decided to use the South Wilts Community Web Site. (Now the South Wiltshire area of Wiltshire Community Web).

Later in 2003 I set up a site for the Chalke Valley Sports Centre, with a page for each of the Sports Clubs using the Sports Centre, it was soon clear that each club needed more than one page after I received the information that the clubs wished to be published on the internet.

Various pages were set up for each club depending on the information to be published. These included an information page, a contacts page, a fixtures page, a results page, a membership form page, and a history page. Luckily not all the clubs required one of each. To advertise the web site we printed the web address on our correspondence, and advertised in the local village magazines, of Bishopstone, Bowerchalke, Broad Chalke, and Ebbesbourne Wake.

Although the Sports Centre is in Broad Chalke, it is funded by the Parish Councils of Alvediston, and the above villages. The original project was fronted by a committee, which included people from the West End of the Chalke Valley, interested in sport. This committee with the financial backing of the above Parish Councils, Sport

England, the football clubs, cricket clubs, tennis club, and table tennis club, managed to raise over £550,000.00 to have the Sports Centre built.

The Wiltshire Community Web Tutorials were marvellously simple and a great help in learning the early tips and tricks. There are usually some extra tips on each issue of the Wiltshire Community Web Newsletter which we found helpful.

Since its inception, the Chalke Valley Sports Centre web site has been updated at least once a month with the current month's bookings. We have also used the diary area to advertise our annual fete, and have had cause to use the Mail Listings. Our web site does not have so many pages for each club now, as the Cricket and Football Clubs have their own web sites, but we still maintain a page for both of these two clubs, as a link to their own web sites.

The web site has been useful to the sports clubs as we have received many members who found out about us via the internet. I still have history pages to complete, and so the site is being amended on a regular basis.
