New Gallery Template Launched April 2008

Wiltshire Community Web (WCW) now has a new template for you to incorporate into your own WCW site. (Available in Kennet, North Wiltshire and West Wiltshire districts only)

The Gallery template is available as one of the nine different templates that you can choose from to build your WCW pages.

You can add up to 20 pictures that will be displayed as thumbnails which can be enlarged by your site visitors at a click of the mouse. You can also change the sequence of the pictures after upload.

The total size of all the images to be uploaded should not exceed 4Mb, but you can upload some images and then go back and upload more to the same page later.

Spotlight on a Wiltshire Community Web Site

The Wiltshire and Swindon Neighbourhood Watch Association represents the (approx) 4500 NHW schemes (covering some 50,000 individual households) across Wiltshire & Swindon which are run by volunteer Coordinators.



The website is an important element of our communication strategy and has been designed and implemented by our Treasurer Dave Colledge (we are currently looking for a Secretary and for a 'full time' webmaster!).

The Association Committee comprises representatives of NHW Coordinators at various levels (Scheme, Area, Community Area, Section & Division) and meets quarterly with Police officers and the civilian Police NHW Liaison Officers to resolve issues raised by NHW Schemes and to improve working relationships between Police and NHWatchers on the ground.
