	5.4 The Clerk circulated the budget estimate. Wilts Cllr B Wayman said that	
	Wiltshire Council tax will rise by 2%.in line with increases by the Fire Brigade	
	and the Police. In future, if there are any schemes put before CATG, the PC will	
	be expected to fund 25% of the cost. The Area Boards will expect organisations	
	applying for grants to match fund and PCs to make a 25% contribution.	
	Residents are being asked to help their communities in a voluntary capacity. As	
	the PC will not receive the grant from Wilts Council with the precept the Chmn	
	recommended a precept of £7,218.99 which would represent 0% on the Council	
	tax. The precept will be set at the January meeting.	
	Chilmark Playground Management Cttee applied for a grant from the Area Board	
	for purchasing bark which cost £1,223.04. The Area Board has granted £532, the	
	Playground Cttee £532, leaving a shortfall of £159. The PC had agreed to	
	contribute 10% of the cost but not more than £200. Cllr ML proposed that PC

	7.2 HGVs travelling to EDH site	
	There has been an increase in vehicle movements and lorries travelling in the

	7.3 Stones along Cow Drove Verge	
	Highways are required to remove stones on the verge if hazardous to motorists,	
	so residents have replaced the stones with white posts. Cllr M L contacted the	Cllr ML
	Senior Traffic Engineer, Julie Wharton about vehicles speeding down Cow Drove	
	but she claims it is not now her area of responsibility.	
	7.4 Kent's Hill is a BOAT- question about future maintenance.	
	Wilts Cllr Wayman said that Wiltshire Council has a responsibility to maintain it	
	as a byway. Nick Cowan, Rights of Way Officer claims that it is in better	
	condition that many other rights of way. It is not a Highways responsibility but	
	residents could club together to make improvements. Sir RP said that in view of	
	additional development would Wilts Council consider adopting it? Wilts	
	Councillor Wayman was clear that Wilts Council will not adopt it as a highway	
	when it is a Byway Open to All Traffic. The Chmn suggested that a way forward	
	is for the three residents most concerned to research the matter and take advice	
	from a solicitor.

	which is too constricted to allow for a greater flow of water. The open ditch along	
	Hindon Lane and the channel between Forge Cottage and Becketts Lane junction	
	have been cleared and should not form any restriction to flow this year. The short	
	section downstream of Becketts Lane culvert is the concern of Wiltshire Highways	
	Senior Drainage Engineer. The Parish Council has taken the required action to
