	7.3 PC supports Emergency Response Team's Application to SSE for	
	an emergency generator. The Chmn explained that Fovant PC had	
	applied for a grant from SSE for 2 small generators and lighting	
	equipment. In the event of flooding, the generator can power the	
	emergency lights at night. If Chilmark is successful with the	
	application one could be kept at Ridge and the other in a steel cabinet	
	in the yard behind the Reading Room or a preferred location. The	
	Clerk was asked to write to the Secretary or Chair of the Reading	Clerk
	Room, supplying dimensions and full details, to ask if they would be	
	agreeable to this arrangement. It transpired that the grant application	
	had to be submitted before the deadline which was before the PC	
	meeting. The Chair of the Reading Room confirmed that the	
	Committee does not want the responsibility for the maintenance nor	
	the cost insurance, or the storage of fuel. The Chmn said that there

	would be 5 litres in a steel lockable cabinet which is fire proof. The	
	Vice Chmn said that it would most likely be used in an emergency	
	during an electricity failure. There may be some associated	
	expenditure for which they would ask the PC for a contribution. The	
	Chmn proposed the PC acceptance of the SSE grant application. All	
	agreed.	
	The PC is resolved to purchase a SID in conjunction with	
	neighbouring parishes.	
	The Chmn explained that the device monitors the speed of	
	approaching vehicles and some even display smiling and	
	disapproving faces. The Area Board will give a grant towards the	
	purchase of a unit to be shared amongst a consortium of villages. It	
	may be possible for Chilmark to join with Dinton and Teffont and we	
	await information and costings from Charles Smith, of Dinton PC.	
	The cost could be in the region of $\pounds 500$ and it would run off a solar	
	panel and be fixed with brackets to poles on the B3089 in the vicinity	
	of the Black Dog, locations which are agreed by Highways Dept. This	
	was considered and the Vice Chmn recommended no action for the	
	short term and all agreed.

	applicants have had difficulties obtaining registration with	
	Homes4Wiltshire and homes have been allocated to applicants from

	other catchment areas who do not meet the criteria. More publicity needs to be given to inform applicants they should apply through the Open Housing Register. If they have difficulties then they should contact the Parish Council. This advice should be advertised in Village Voice and the subject brought forward in 2 years' time. <u>17/07223/FUL – Fairways, Frog Lane, SP3 5BB, Extension and Conversion of Garage to extra bedroom</u> . No comment. <u>17/07458/FUL – No 8 Ridgeway, SP3 5BX. Fit Grey Cementile Cladding to the rendered areas of the property.</u> Normally it is only necessary to comply with building regs but in the AONB, applicants must seek planning permission. No comment. <u>No 6 Ridgeway – Certificate of Lawfulness</u> Building regulations were complied with but the window in the gable end of the house requires planning permission.
